

The Reordering of All Things

From the writings of the Christian Martyr, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, comes a devotional entry entitled "The Beginning of a Complete Reordering of All Things."

According to this pastor/professor, when God chooses Mary to be instrumental for God's coming into this world in all lowliness, it is not an idle family occurrence but the beginning of a complete reordering, new ordering, of all things. <u>If we want to participate in this Advent-happening</u>, we cannot stand by as observers, enjoying all the Christmas trappings; on the contrary we will be drawn into this Act of God, this reordering of all things. <u>If we want to participate</u>, we must accept and play our part in this redemption drama. \*

These consequential thoughts from Bonhoeffer are supported by Scripture. Lowliness attends the birth of Jesus through and through, and this is the King of kings and Lord of lords. Jesus was poor, yet rich; weak, yet strong; servant, yet master; defeated, yet victorious. From birth to death and resurrection of Jesus the biblical accounts show the reordering of all things.

A consequential faith, the only authentic faith, determined Bonhoeffer's choices and actions in his all-too-brief life. All things for him were reordered; thus he upset the powers: political, economic, and ecclesiastical. Security and success were to be found neither in a quiet Lutheran pastorate nor in an American professorship. The established churches of Germany, too closely aligned with the government, had forsaken their prophetic charge, abandoned the practice of mercy, and disowned any pursuit of justice. As Jesus disturbed the powers, incurring their wrath, so also the disciple, Dietrich Bonhoeffer. One of the last acts of Adolf Hitler was to order the execution of this remarkable man, whose participation in the Advent-happening, the reordering of all things, assured him of Life as opposed to and beyond a mere existence.



# **Stewardship**

#### From Deuteronomy 26: 9-11

"He brought us to this place and gave us the land, a land flowing with milk and honey; <sup>10</sup> and now I bring the first fruits of the soil that you, O Lord, have given me. <sup>11</sup>...you shall rejoice in all good things the Lord your God has given to you and your household."

Like many verses in the Bible, God's word, holds greater meaning than when first read. The story of the Israelites' journey out of Egypt and from bondage is familiar to us. These verses tell of their arrival to the land promised, a promise made and kept by God. This is a truth about God. The promises he makes to you and me, all of us, are and will be kept.

Described as a land flowing with milk and honey, the speaker envisions a beautiful, productive, and bountiful place for them to live. God's promise is not limited to the Israelites. It is a promise conveyed to us through the Prophets of the Old Testament and through Jesus Christ in the New Testament. God's promise to us is to live in peace, a full and bountiful life in his kingdom today and in his heavenly kingdom. The question is how much are we aware of God's promise for such a "land" and life this day.

In these verses, there is a feeling of joy in worship of God in recognition of what he has done for them. In response, in a mood of thanksgiving, the speaker in verse 10 offers to God what is asked, the first of his fruit from the cultivated land. Here too, there rings joy in the opportunity and ability to offer to God his first fruits – because it is a promise kept by God in giving abundance to the Israelite. We too, return to God of our first fruits. He has given us the ability to work and earn our keep in his earthly kingdom.

He has given us talent that has value, allowing us to receive income that supports our needs. God is providing. We have moved from an agrarian society to an economic society. Our first fruit comes from the money we earn and not in bushels of wheat gown at the will of God.

During the last few months, I have opened myself to God and scripture. The verses have been spoken to me by the Holy Spirit in ways not heard before. They caused me to reflect on the blessings received from God in my life and I have been remiss in my joyful giving.

Please, for your own soul, reflect again upon the above passage. How is the Holy Spirit speaking to you? Are you at peace with God?
