
And this is how our life at Calvary Church will look:

ANNUAL GIVING CAMPAIGN

Our stewardship campaign is based around Paul's words of instruction to Timothy in 1 Timothy 6. Paul tells Timothy and the rest of us that the true way to be rich has more to do with our hearts than our bank accounts.

...be rich in good deeds, and to be generous and willing to share. In this way, they will lay up treasure for themselves as a firm foundation for the coming age, so that they may take hold of the life that is truly life. (1 Tim. 6:18-19, NIV)

We will learn what the ways that we may be rich in ways that can truly satisfy. We will have the opportunity to practice generosity though the giving of our gifts to God and the work of the church. Commitment Sunday will be on November 19 at the morning worship services.

THE END OF OUR COOPERATIVE PARISH RELATIONSHIP

Both congregations that made up the Calvary/Centennial Memorial United Methodist Cooperative Parish have agreed to bring to an end the Cooperative Parish relationship. This relationship began in 2010 as ways for the two congregation to bring their resources together in order to do greater ministry. Over the years, various projects have started or matured through this relationship, included The Lord's Laundry, Family Emergency Shelter and 2nd Street and Hope. Centennial Church made the request to become an independent congregation and had the means to do so.

The change has been discussed at length at both churches and at an open meeting with members of each congregation together. In September, the Bishop and cabinet discussed the request and decided to grant Centennial Memorials request. Centennial Memorial UMC and Calvary UMC will continue to work collegially on various projects and ministries as each congregation sees fit. Rev. Julie Wilson will continue to work for both congregations. The Baltimore Washington Conference will consider the pastoral needs of each congregation on its own. And we will no longer refer to the Cooperative Parish on our website, bulletins and other written materials.

New Fellowship Groups

In an effort to start new connections and deepen relationships within the congregation, Calvary Church will be holding a Kickoff Event for Fellowship Groups on Wednesday, November 15 at both 2:00 PM and 7:30 PM. Fellowship Groups are informal gatherings of people around a common interest. This might be playing board games or cards, going for a hike, eating at a restaurant, or discussing a book. The idea is for the groups to be small enough to allow people to share and get to know one another, but large enough to let people form new connections with others. Each group would then be between 5 and 9 persons.

The Kickoff Event will be held with two sessions: one during the day and the other in the evening. Those individuals or couples that come can explore among the various suggested interests/ activities or suggest additional interest/activity that others might find want to pursue. Each group would then plan to meet three or four times between the Kickoff Event and the end of February 2018 when an another Kick Off event will be offered. This way nobody is locked into a long-term commitment or particular group and there will always be new groups forming throughout the course of the year. Childcare will not be offered at the Kickoff Event, but childcare may be an option for groups that form and identify this need.

CHURCH AND SOCIETY

Probably no one would disagree that the Church, in our case Calvary United Methodist Church, should have an internal and an external focus. Neither focus can be authentic without the other. The internal focus is church centered; the external focus is world centered. Both are endorsed by Scripture. The internal focus raises awareness and prepares for the external focus of the church. Gathering precedes going; receiving precedes giving; worship precedes actions; faith precedes works. Thanksgiving precedes sharing. The authenticity of the former can be measured by engagement in the latter.

Thanks to our forebears, our worship of God transpires in an imposing sanctuary. Thanks to our pastors, we hear the Scriptures' timely messages for the church, of course, with both internal and external foci. Our internal focus is enhanced by wonderful *offerings* of music, thanks to our talent-ed musicians. In worship, we sense the reality of the Kingdom of God, an awesomeness that summons a deep loyalty, a loyalty that surpasses and judges other loyalties. For through worship we are encountering, being confronted by, God, who is Love, who through Jesus directs our focus beyond ourselves and through the Holy Spirit removes prejudices and self-interests, inspiring us towards compassion for 'the least of these."

Someone suggested that the church is as a nerve over which the otherwise unfelt pain of the world moves. The church does not, cannot, ignore the pain. "For God so loved the world that God gave..." Thanks be to God. Such Thanksgiving has an internal and external focus. Thanksgiving is something we say, but it is also something we do.

HUNGER AND HOMELESSNESS AWARENESS EVENTS

Each year in November Frederick takes part in a week of Hunger and Homelessness Awareness events. The week of Nov. 12-18, 2017 is that week this year. The week starts off with the interfaith community serving the meal at soup kitchen on Sunday evening, followed by a prayer walk around downtown. The annual prayer walk visits a house of worship, a non-profit, and a place of shelter. Each symbolizes the larger collective of community partners working to serve our neighbors in need. Then, on Tuesday, Nov. 14 from 7-9pm at Hood College's Rosenstock Hall the annual community forum on homelessness will be presented by the Frederick County Commission on Homelessness (of which Calvary is a member). On Saturday, September 30 a dozen members from Calvary descended upon the home of an aging neighbor in need of some assistance. These willing servants removed vegetation (including overgrown bushes and even poison ivy), replaced rotten and damaged trim, gave shutters and the front door a fresh coat of paint, planted some bulbs and mulched the beds, and even removed several hundred pounds of trash and "the stuff of life" that tends to pile up over the years. All of this was part of a Habitat for Humanity Brush with Kindness project. These short term projects make a big impact in the lives of neighbors, often older members of the community, who are in need of a little extra assistance.

The outreach project was an intergenerational effort with volunteers spanning the generations from young adults to seniors. We had long time and not so long time Calvary members come out as well as one person who has only recently started coming and is hoping to become a member soon. Some stayed for only a short time, some stayed from start to finish.

The group had such a good experience that when some of them heard that the United Methodist Women may be working with Habitat for Humanity on a Women's Build in the spring, they were ready to sign up to help then and there.

We have often heard about the "pebble dropped into the pool". This analogy is about one act will have an effect that may be far reaching as the ripples move outward. Another analogy is the butter-fly's flutter could cause a whirlwind on the other side of the earth. Have you seen the bumper sticker: "Practice Random Acts of Kindness"?

Acts 2: 46-47 gives a picture of the early church. "⁴⁶ Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, ⁴⁷ praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." The new church was a close association of its Christian member. They were eating together, hosts welcoming others into their homes, talking about Christ's teachings, death and resurrection. They were caring for one another in love and kindness. Acts of grace and mercy were being accomplished to fellow Christians and to those on the peripheral of the close knit community. A "pebble" of Christian love dropped into a pool of a sinful world – giving favor to all people. The ripple effect resulted in the Lord adding to their number daily. Lost souls were being saved by random acts of kindness.

Acts 2 is a chapter that provides principles of stewardship as we practice our Christian faith. As Christians, use of our material possessions in harmony with the will of God, will encourage people to believe in Jesus Christ. Reread Acts 2: 47. The Christian Jews, in the early church, were eating together in their homes, land was sold to support those in need so that none would be impoverished.

The general public saw these acts and the results they had upon everyone. The ripples flowed over them from simple acts of goodness. They wanted to be a part of this group and believed in what Christ taught and as put into practice. Those unsaved responded to the unselfish and generous attitudes and actions of Christians among them.

This applies to us today, as Disciples of Christ. Our acts of kindness, through the generous giving from our material possessions, and their use in generous unselfish acts and attitudes toward others can lead those who seek peace and comfort in Christ to our Lord and who lives in our lives. This principle of our acts of generosity and kindness will have an everlasting effect upon everyone who sees. It is a Christian stewardship principle should be foremost in our minds during this month of church wide commitment to God.

Poinsettia Orders




