But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which is alive today and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith?

In the middle of this hectic season, I invite you to consider the lilies--- or, in our case, the changing leaves. Take a moment to stop and breathe and remember the one who created this beauty. Don't let the busyness of the season--- the worry, the stress, the schedule--- keep you from noticing God's glory just outside the window. And if you need help to stop and consider the lilies, join us for small groups, open prayer, or the Women's retreat, where we encourage one another on this journey of faith and deepen our trust in God!



Last month Frederick City celebrated its annual Saturday event of "In the Street". As in previous years, Calvary participated with a table display of information that tells Calvary's story and our impact upon the community. A few of our members and our clergy were available through the day to talk to people who stopped at our station.

A few people showed interest and stopped to talk and learn more about Calvary's ministry to the community. Those who stopped indicated that they had prior contact with Calvary and that it was through themselves or their children attending the Weekday School. Kudos to the Weekday School for such a strong and long standing ministry.

Except for those few, no one stopped because they felt the Spirit upon them. I felt the presence of God in their midst by our being there. I kept thinking about the tens of hundreds of people shuffling by us with only a glance and trying to not make eye contact. It was as if they were fearful we would "touch" them with the Gospel of Christ and the Holy Spirit would leap into them for their personal Pentecost. I am glad that we were there – for we were and are the presence of God.

The whole scene, people following one another with an air of lack of awareness, brought to mind readings from Isaiah, in particular Chapters 40 and 41. The Israelites of Judah were worshiping God on their own terms, not the way God wanted them to worship him. They followed the laws and commandments but without the spiritual feeling that God asks. They were mindlessly making their sacrifices but not from their heart and they were living a life that paid less attention to values and morals than attending the poor and needy. Isaiah was warning them of a great change coming to their world that would bring woe beyond understanding. If they would not change their ways of idolatry to the way of God, then they would live without God as their protector.

Calvary's presence was the presence of God to the people of this day. We were in the image of Isaiah. Telling Calvary's faith story and ministry provided a glimmer that may have been the spark to flame a recognition of God's Holiness and his grace and mercy offered to them. Maybe, just maybe, they would later remember something about a God that reached out to them through us.

As Isaiah, we were the voice in the wilderness; calling "prepare the way for the Lord" (Isa 40:36). We were called to be God's presence and witness that day and every day. You too were with us, by being part of the Body of Christ at Calvary.

Charge Conference Scheduled October 18

The annual meeting where the church reviews its ministries and celebrates its connection with the larger United Methodist Church will take place on Tuesday, October 18 at 7:00 PM. The Frederick District Superintendent, The Rev Edgardo Rivera will be present to lead the meeting as the church makes several reports on the building, the ministries, the membership and the financial health of the congregation.

This year, the meeting is open for all to attend in addition to all of the voting is members of the Church Council. One particular item of importance this year is the decision for Calvary to bring to an end the Cooperative Parish relationship with Centennial Memorial United Methodist Church. This comes at Centennial Church's request and has been discussed at both churches. Agenda items also include: voting to approve the candidacy of Jeff Zalatoris for ordained ministry, renewal of certified lay servant status for Bert Edmonson, election of new persons in leadership roles, report of the pastors and deacon, approval of the compensation packages for each clergy under appointment and action on those members who have become inactive.

Hurricane Relief

As of September 18, the friends and member of Calvary Church have contributed \$3,218. We will send this with a matching amount from the church Mission Fund to the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR). Thank you.

Be ye doers of the Word and not hearers only!

Although it is one of the shortest letters of the New Testament, that written by James, who ministered to the early Judean Christian Church, is as much a blueprint as any of the letters for the church in today's society. For it calls us to action ... witnessing for Christ in a broken world! James reminds us that listening to God's word is necessary, but not sufficient if we do not put it into practice (*James* 1: 22). And, while he does not negate our justification before God by Faith, the Apostle Paul's dictum, James' letter to the early church reminds us more than any of the other letters that faith without works is shallow (*James* 2: 14-18).

How relevant this message is in today's society, in which, as reported by evangelist Bill Tenny-Brittain (*BWC UMConnection Daily*, June 5, 2009, p. 5), while 76 percent of Americans say they are Christians, only 14.8 percent attend church, the number one reason for such lack of engagement being that they perceive Christians as hypocrites, not practicing what they preach. Although we've heard that often in our lives, and tend at times to dismiss it as an excuse offered by those who are not active in the church, I believe we would be foolish indeed to dismiss such a perception completely out of hand.

United Methodists are called to renew the spirit of mission ... being sent into the world by and for God ... the essence of John Wesley's ministry, reaching those in need. Was such action not also the essence of Jesus' earthly ministry? Yes, the Scriptures remind us that Jesus regularly visited the Temple, where he praised God, taught, and prayed; but his commitment to God did not end there! His ministry was in the community (e.g., Mathew 5; Luke 4: 16-21), a ministry to which he commended his disciples (e.g., Mathew 10: 5-14; 25: 31-46; 28: 16-21.)

As we proclaim as a congregation in the benediction following our weekly worship service at Calvary, after preparing for the Word, hearing the Word, and responding to the Word, we go forth into the world to put the Word into action ... to serve others in the name of Christ Jesus. During this time of reflection on our stewardship of material and spiritual gifts given us by God, we are asked to think of additional ways in which we might grow as disciples and serve God in the community about us through the ministries of Calvary. Jesus reminds us, as he did the earliest disciples, that the opportunities for doing so are abundant (*Mathew* 9: 37-38).

Calvary's weekly electronic newsletter lists a number of the opportunities by which we might witness for Christ in everyday ways such that the unchurched and others in need of God's love will see the face of Christ in each of us!
