

## From Pastor Shannon



#### Capital Campaign

After receiving a favorable report from the feasibility study conducted in the fall and winter, the Church Council voted in January to proceed with a capital campaign to address this need. We have secured the services of a capital fund raising firm to plan and implement a campaign. Our consultant has worked with us to get organized, prepare materials and assemble the leadership team. The quiet phase of the campaign will continue over the summer. The public portion of the campaign will be launched on Sunday, August 4 and continue through mid-November.

#### **Youth Mission Trip**

The youth mission this summer will take place in Pittsburgh, PA, Monday July 15 through Friday, July 19. The group will be working with a Christian non-profit organization called The Pittsburgh Project to provide home repairs to vulnerable homeowners while also provide youth with an opportunity to build relationships and understanding with people living in the inner city. Each evening, there are times for games, worship and small group discussion to build leadership skills among the campers. Rev. Steve Larsen will be leading this year's group made up of seven adults and eleven youth.



## **Emergency Family Shelter at Calvary**

This September the Emergency Family Shelter, the shelter program which involves families with children spending their nights at various congregations on a rotating basis from week to week, will begin its fifth year in Frederick. This July will be Calvary's 8th time hosting the families since the program began in 2014 (our 14th time if you count the times we partnered with Centennial to host). Over these past four years we have learned a great deal about ourselves and our neighbors who participate in the program.

We have learned and observed (in no particular order) that:

- The littlest members of our community cannot control their circumstances
- You can't always predict their response to being shown kindness
- Families come in all shapes and sizes
- Finding a job is difficult when you need to worry about finding your next meal and childcare and many other things each and every day
- Moving every week is tough on kids and adults, but not as tough as not knowing at all where you will sleep that night
- Our community is good at giving easy assistance, such as food and clothing to those in need
- Our community is not always good at providing affordable housing or other systemic answers to deeply rooted problems
- We need both to help families not just survive, but thrive
- It's hard to find, and keep, good staff when nonprofit organizations such as the Religiously Coalition for Emergency Human Needs have such stretched budgets (shelter staff don't get paid well for the long and odd hours they work)
- Good volunteers are crucial to the success of the program

The shelter will be with us starting the evening of Saturday July 6th and moving out the morning of July 20th. If you have never helped before but are interested in learning how to help now, talk to me and I will give you all the details and training that you will need.

We will host the shelter at Calvary most likely four or five more times before it moves into a permanent site, on Hayward Road, near the water tower. The Religious Coalition has purchased the property and will be doing major renovations to it over the next two years. The permanent site will allow for more stability (no more rotating each week) and an expansion of the program (from a maximum of 15 persons to up to 45 or even 50). Even after the move, however, volunteers will still be needed to help ensure the program is a success.

Together, let's welcome the families when they come to Calvary this July, and let's help make Frederick county a community we are proud for all of us to be able to call home.

"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. <sup>10</sup>Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers." Galatians 6: 9-10

Jesus said often and in many ways that doing good was living a righteous life in the

eyes of God. He emphasized that living a righteous life should not be lived in lite heartedness, but lived with a strong will to overcome obstacles and our own reluctance and self-centeredness.

"Let us not become weary" was Paul's admonition to the Galatian Church; not to tire or turn from what was called of the Galatians is applicable to disciples today. We seem to be turning inward as God's church and as a people of God.

Paul's warning about weariness of living a righteous life was also reflected by his use of an athlete training to be a top competitor and his view of his own completing the race of a faithful life as being well run. The implication is practice in training, physical sacrifice to reach greater abilities and a dedication to the call.

In my opinion, Calvary is entering into a period of its history that is of great challenge in meeting a direction that is different from the past and in the degree of our commitment to the support of the ministry of Calvary in the local and world setting. We need to prepare ourselves in attitude that is reflective of what we know about God, and most important, your relationship with God. We must thing in terms of faith and personal commitment of "doing good" that requires greater personal and congregational sacrifice – even to the point of becoming "weary" in the effort.

Paul reminds the Galatian Church of God's promises. "At the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."; and if we exert greater personal sacrifice for a period to meet the things that seem to separate us, if we continue to worship our God in the way we believe we should, with all grace, honor, whole heart, mind and soul; then we, in this life or in the heavenly life, will reap a harvest. This is a promise of God. To give of ourselves and to give of God's given wealth. We respond by, giving abundantly, sacrificially and gratefully.

This is a time to remember Joshua – you may want to follow other gods, gods of selfishness to keep God's blessings bound to self, to worship at a lesser level than that which reflects a true first fruits offering and praise, but this is a time as Joshua to choose how we follow our God. This is a time to make every conscious effort to live in a righteous way.
