# Volunteers In Mission

In July of 2017 a team from Calvary, Centennial, and Middletown UMC's went to Vieques, Puerto Rico. The team worked on a variety of projects while they were there, including tearing down a wall in the dorm building and building a new one. The old wall (which Calvary has also built, back in 2005) was made of wood and lots of glass windows. The new wall was



concrete block and would include louvre-style hurricane windows. The team had to leave the wall unfinished because the windows were not yet delivered. One week before the hurricane hit in 2017 Pastor Alex got some folks from his church together to install the windows and finish the wall. When the hurricane hit the church had some major damage, but the new wall in the common room of the dormitory stood, so the church in Esperanza used that space to hold worship services for several months. They also used the space for shelter and other needs. To this day, when teams come to the island, they share the testimony of the team from Maryland and the timeliness, God's timing, of the wall.

The team that traveled to Vieques this year was much smaller, only nine, but they were no less productive. They worked on two homes. In one, our volunteers we under the guidance of a highly skilled foreman who spoke no English, so by listening to the interpreter and following the example of Sabatino, they were able to make some major repairs to Alfonzo's home. Meanwhile, the rest of the crew worked on Milta's home. They were fortunate that another crew had already done all of the roof repairs, so they got to stay in cooler areas. The majority of the work involved patching concrete and painting. A couple of people were also tasked with hanging new doors, including replacing some door frames. By the end of the week, the home was ready for the electrician to re-wire the entire home. Milta's home had not had electricity, other than an extension chord from across the street, since the hurricane struck.

Juan, Milta's son who also lives in the home, stopped by on the last day to thank the team and tell them (using a translation application on his phone) that they are a blessing to so many.





"May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us; establish the work of our hands for us - yes, establish the work of our hands" Psalm 90: 17

As we enter into the commitment phase of the *Renewal and Rejoice* campaign for the new organ, this psalm is worth thinking about.

We are endeavoring to install a new pipe organ for our holy space of a sanctuary and to enhance our worship in a beautiful building. We have picked up the mantel of the legacy established by those who have come before us for the past 250 years. Each church generation has made sacrificial effort to improve their place of worship and further God's kingdom in Frederick. Calvary started as a few worshipers in a small room in 1770. They had a clear and pure message of the gospel and have grown to a congregation of over 1000 today. With God's word, our forefathers grew from church building to church building, piano to organ, through social strife, political discord and wars, (one war in our own backyard), while facing an unknown future at each major step.

Calvary has an opportunity to renew its spirit and enhance our worship with a much needed replacement organ. Our effort, in the face of our own unknowns, is a testament of a people of strong faith in God. It is a testament to people of the community who may recognize what we do and respond by becoming a part of this congregation that faithfully responds to God's call. "May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us" be seen by all peoples.

"Establish the work of our hands for us" is a prayer to God to be the guiding hand of this campaign conducted in his name. It is a prayer to have God's hand guide us in all of our ministries. To "establish" by God is to make the effort holy and eternal by playing music with heavenly choirs in praise as we praise him on this earth.

An earlier building project was the installation of the Peal Bells in the church tower. This building project was made about 15 years. Since their installation, people coming from places far from Frederick, heard them peal to God's glory. I envision people coming to hear the organ and singing in praise of God – in harmony with the organ that God has blessed to our care.

This is our generation's legacy to future Calvary congregations and the Frederick community we serve. I am a part of that legacy – you are a part of that legacy – be a joyful participant and rejoice in your spirit.
