

What Is "Advent" Anyway?

Advent is season leading up to Christmas. The word *Advent* comes from a Latin word *adventus*, which moves "coming." The season is marked by expectation, anticipation, preparation, and longing. There is a yearning for deliverance from the evils of the world. It is the cry of those who have experienced the tyranny of injustice, and yet carry the hope of deliverance by a God.

Advent is all about the hope that God, however distant God sometimes seems, will set things right. God will arrive on the scene to rule with truth and justice over all the people and even over creation itself. This hope goes back to the time of the ancient prophets, who longed for a time when "the crooked shall be made straight and the rough places made plain." The hope is taken up again and again even to the present day.

In the season of Advent, we hear about the coming of the Christ-- not just once long ago in Bethlehem of Judea, but who will also come in final victory at the end of time. The same Christ comes to us now in Word and Spirit. The word "Christ" comes from Greek word for "anointed". The Hebrew word for "anointed" is "Messiah."

This year, the season of Advent starts on Sunday December 1 and ends on Christmas eve. During this season, let us prepare ourselves for what God has in store for us. As the scripture lessons tell the story first of promise then of birth, we can come to see how God comes to be born in us and among us today.

Here is a prayer that might help us shape a holy Advent for us this year:

Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, O Promised One. Once again, we come to this time of Advent and await your presence. Give us the patience to seek the meaning of these busy days. Give us the courage to wait in times of pain and trouble. Give us the compassion to tow for one another. Give us the faith to wait for the Messiah when we are threatened by the Herods of this world. Give us the hope to wait for the Savior even when we cannot hear the angels singing. Give us the love that does not wait when it meets Christ in our neighbor. Amen.




Renew and Rejoice Campaign

On Sunday, November 17, the announcement was made that we have completed the active portion of the Renew and Rejoice Campaign to raise money for a new pipe organ. The campaign raised more than \$880,000 as of November 20. Nearly 70 committee volunteers contributed their time to the project, which resulted in 132 gifts and pledges from members and community supporters.

The Renew and Rejoice Campaign, launched in August 2019, aims to raise \$1,600,000 to replace the church's failing pipe organ, which dates back to 1930 and includes parts from the church's second pipe organ constructed in 1911. Age, failing relays and wiring, deterioration of the winding system in the console and throughout the organ, along with outdated technology, are major factors in the decision to raise funds for a replacement.

"The Renew and Rejoice Campaign has been a wonderful project for our church," said Rev. Dr. Larsen. "It has revitalized many connections between members, created new friendships, and helped us evaluate our mission and long-range goals. As we move forward in our fundraising efforts to complete the pipe organ project, we move as a stronger congregation in many ways." The campaign will continue to seek additional contributions for members as well as grants, community business and other sources over the next three years.





Greetings from the Calvary Weekday School! This month the three and four year old classes will hold Parent Teacher Conferences. 


Henderson Settlement Mission Trip 2019




You are invited to attend an afternoon of fellowship and reflection as we journey together at our Advent by Candlelight event.

For ease, I will call him Mike. Mike was working through his problem of how to allocate his finance in his life. He was trying to satisfy his needs of living in a world that demanded money toward food, lodging, insurance, etc. We all must work through that "living" stuff.

Mike, while in prayer, was hearing the voice of God. His prayers about his financial limitations and his faith living were often lifted up. He wanted to increase this year's pledge to the church by, what was to him a large increase. Mike had already committed to the previous Building Fund for the new pipe organ. Mike responded to the voice he heard in prayer. He committed to both in the amounts he wanted — even though this would clearly make him skimp on other things that he would have liked to have. Mike was giving back to God in an attitude of gratitude, and in a sacrificial way.

Mike's story could end at this point with his decision to respond in faith. However, God's ways are grand and our God has demonstrated through history to give beyond our own hopes.

"God is good...All the time!" At work, Mike was looking at his new medical plan for the next year. Putting pencil to paper to calculate his cost of his benefits, Mike realized the numbers were not the same as last year. An expected increase was in fact a surprising decrease. And, the decrease was exactly the same amount as his newly increased commitment to both pledges at the church. "All the time...God is good!"
