

Did God Just Speak to ME?

There is a question that burdens me on occasion – a fairly common question to be sure. "How much longer will the Church be around?"

I've heard it regarding the organ campaign, and indeed any large capital improvement. There is legitimate concern that one's financial investment in the Church be a sensible one.

"If the Church ends tomorrow, then I've wasted my money."

"Maybe I should wait until I know for sure."

"Let's just hold back, especially with all this friction in the UMC."

Yeah, it makes perfect sense – yet Calvary has pledged almost 1 million dollars thus far toward the new organ – 2/3 of the way there! Even with this lingering question, the Church is stepping forward – wow!

The phrase we hear most often that this scenario illustrates is: "stepping out in faith". It's the reason church members pledge to their church's annual budget in addition to special projects. And, I would add, the reason people give of their time, talents, and energy in addition to financial support. But sometimes those words seem to ring a bit hollow to me because I hear them often enough. What am I missing? It must be more than a marketing ploy. (Forgive me, Lord.) Where is my faith?

Though I use the organ to highlight concerns about the future, I mostly wonder about all aspects of the Church – its worship and mission. I never expected to find an answer – I just had to "believe". Well, just when I was cocky enough to accept *faith as ambiguity*, God tapped me on the shoulder and introduced me to a new friend – her name is Faith. Yes, Faith – with a capitol "F". Here's what happened:

One November Sunday I hustled the children's choir to the chancel steps to sing. Once settled into position, I suddenly saw what was before me. Adorned in blue and filling the Sanctuary with their song of praise, I received clarity about the future of the Church – the future of Calvary!

I even remember turning to the congregation and saying: "Here's your future!"

Of course, the children are the future – no great revelation there. But what it clarified in my heart was very revealing to me. Seeing 13 in choir this year instead of 3 last year, witnessing their eagerness to learn about Jesus, and listening to them sing and shout, I truly saw, for the first time, that there is indeed a future for the Church. When I met Faith, I received a more complete answer to that lingering, nagging question.



I offer my personal gratitude and admiration to all of you that know Faith. And I hope my story will help those of you who, like me, fret and worry about the future, to meet Faith – face to face.

Indeed, Faith knows the future. She is not blind. Faith sees far better than you and I. With Faith's help, we will create the answer, making it *the reality for the present* and have an *impact on the future*. This I believe, and I thank God for taking time to speak to me!

The playhouse offers two floors dedicated to imaginative play, creativity and experiential learning. I can't wait to hear what the students have to say about their visit.

Last month I highlighted our music program and this month I want to share some information about our Spanish program. The children have Spanish once a month with Ms. Meghan. The goal of the program is to provide exposure to a different language in a fun and engaging way. Ms. Meghan teaches the students colors, numbers, weather, family members, foods and animals through music, movement and games. In January, Ms. Meghan focused on weather with a song called "Copo de Nieve, Copo de Nieve" or Snowflake, Snowflake. It worked out perfectly with our snowy weather!

2020 Lenten Study

Calvary Church will be providing weekly a church-wide study each Wednesday evening during the Lenten season starting on Wednesday, March 4. This year, our Lenten Study will focus on five essential spiritual practices rooted in Jesus' own walk with God.

Jesus called disciples with a simple invitation: "Come, follow me." Those who wish to follow Jesus Christ today may not follow the footsteps of Jesus in the sand and dusty road, but we can follow him by taking up the spiritual practices and "holy habits" that he observed and commended to others.

Join us this Lent as we draw on the recent work of Adam Hamilton a popular author and lead pastor of the United Methodist Church of the Resurrection in Leawood, Kansas. Hamilton is the author of *The Walk: Five Essential Practices of the Christian Life*.

We'll discover five essential spiritual practices rooted in Jesus' own walk with God. In each chapter, Hamilton's engaging teaching style will help us explore one of these practices its New Testament foundation, and its potential effect on our personal lives and our lives together as the church.

Update on Financial Health

We began 2019 with a budget that would maintain our ministries and facilities at roughly 2018 levels. We soon recognized that we would need to reduce our spending. When some staff left Calvary for other positions, the Staff Parish Relations Committee reassigned duties to other members of the staff saving \$21,000. An additional \$14,000 was saved in operating expenses. However, we ended the year with insufficient funds to pay our conference apportionments in full. We recognize that this hampers the ministry of the wider church and we leave a part of our financial obligations unpaid. This cannot continue.

In December, the Church Council passed a budget of \$697,500 for 2020. This budget balances income and expenses and is 12% smaller than the budget set for 2019. Our intention is to pay our apportionments in full. We will start the year paying at a reduced rate with the hope that we will be able to make additional payments before the year is over.

This 2020 Operating Budget breaks down as follows:

Ministry of the Word (Ordained clergy)	34.4%
Lay Personnel	33.1%
Care of God's House	17.5%
Conference apportionments	6.0%
Program Ministries	4.5%
Administration and Technology	4.4%

Challenges help to remind us of what is important. These challenges also present opportunities for us as a congregation to increase our resourcefulness and stewardship. We will work harder on building our membership and ministries that will attract young families. The church council will review our implementation of the vision plan and how our organization is aligned to fulfill it. While we know that some of these decisions will not be easy, we remain committed to a vibrant future for the church.

Over many generations, the people of this congregation have overcome many challenges by remaining steadfast in our faith and in our commitment to making disciples for Jesus Christ. As we walk forward together, let us find our strength in Him and in the example our predecessors set before us.

Stewardship

Our God blesses each and every one of us as his adopted children. Heard often, this is a God Promise that is accepted but sometimes misunderstood. God blesses us not because we are good, he does not bless us because we do good deeds, he does not bless us because we pray a lot, sing loudly (as Wesley said Lustily) or have perfect attendance in Sunday worship; God blesses us because he loves us. He cares for our well-being, materially, physically and spiritually. God's grace and mercy are so abundant that he willingly gives blessings – even to those who are reprobate sinners, including you and me.



Look at Abram (Abraham), a man living in Ur, who does not know who speaks to him. Abram was a Gentile who did good deeds, he cared for the poor and provided for his family, he protected them. So God spoke to Abram. He was called to gather what he had and go to a land foreign to him and far from what was comfortable and secure.

God promised Abram in Genesis 12: 2-3: "I will make of you a great nation, and I will bless you and make your name great, so that you will be a blessing. I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in all the families of the earth shall be blessed." (Emphasis added) Abram was blessed so that he could be a blessing to others. All Abram needed to do was to accept by faith the word of God, to obey his call and to follow where led. We too are blessed so that we can be a blessing to others. All that we have gained, earned from our labor, saved by means of sound stewardship, are blessings from God. All with which we are blessed, is available to be used as a blessing to others thru our own acts of grace and mercy in the image of God's actions to all of us.

Weather related Closings

In the event of inclement weather that might require closing the church building or canceling activities, the church will post a notice on the church website (www.calvaryumc.org) and Facebook page. You can also call the church number directly for a recorded message (301-662-1464). A decision will be made by the Senior Pastor and posted by 6:30 AM. If there are no cancellations posted, that means that the church will be following its ordinary sched-

Organ Campaign Update

The active phase of the Renew and Rejoice organ capital campaign concluded on November 12. We are now into the "Fulfillment" Phase of the campaign. As of January 15, we have raised \$935,486 in commitments and have received \$309,153 of that amount so far. This is a great accomplishment and represents many givers who believe in the project and want to see our music and worship life continue to be a source of inspiration and renewal for all who come to this place.

In this quieter phase of the campaign, work will continue in two main ways. First, we have established a "Campaign Fulfillment Team" that will oversee the collection of contributions and seek out additional funds through grants and new contributors over the two next years. This team will also oversee how the funds collected will be invested and managed until they are put to use. A second group, to be called the "Organ Building Committee" will begin contacting potential builders to establish plans around the actual organ design. We will need to have some various plans in place that will allow us to maintain the current music program and bridge us over to the construction of the new instrument.

The Board of Trustees has several projects planned for this Winter and Spring

The Trustees have signed a contract for several projects that will be taking place in both the Education and Main Buildings. These include:

Fixing the exterior lights in the rear parking lot as well as in the front area facing onto North Bentz Street

Hanging the stain glass art in the window of the John Wesley Room

Upgrading the light switches for the sanctuary

Installing a dropped ceiling and new lighting for classrooms on the 2nd floor of the Education Building

There will be more extensive work done in the Library to turn it into more of a class-room and conference room. The Memorial Room on the second floor of the Main Building will also be renovated to make it brighter and more aesthetically pleasing. These are projects that have been considered and discussed for several years. The work is expected to begin sometime in February. These projects are being funded from two sources. We are fortunate to receive a substantial grant from the State of Maryland because we have a school in a building that needs upgrading and improvements. Approximately \$22,000 will come from this source. The remaining expenses for these projects, about \$43,000, will come from the interest accumulated from the Calvary Trust Fund.

Children's Church is Now Available at Both Services!

We are delighted to be able to offer this special ministry during both of our Sunday morning worship services. For those that may be unfamiliar with Calvary's Children's Church program, here is a description:



At Calvary, we are proud to do Children's Church just a little bit different. Children in Kindergarten – 3rd Grade are invited to attend Children's Church in our Chapel, after our Children's Message. In the Chapel, we share a story related to the sermon being preached in "big church" and teach children different elements of traditional worship. After we've discussed the sermon, we have plenty of quiet activities the kids can work on while they listen to the rest of the church service together. We've discovered that children love being a part of worship. Providing this opportunity through Children's Church helps them to learn about worship in a fun way and prepares them to worship in "big church" with their family. For Children that choose to stay in our main worship through the whole service, Children's Bulletins are available at our Children's Resource Center right outside of the sanctuary, where you can also find coloring books, pads of paper, and crayons."
