But this year is one that really needs a lot of prayer, so Pastor Shannon also wanted to share this prayer by former school chaplain Rev. Heidi Carrington Heath:

Holy One,

I don't think I know what I'm doing.

Today, my baby bird is leaving the nest. They are flying off to Kindergarten, or freshman year, or a college campus.

I'm not ready for this goodbye, but I thought I was. Will you hold my hand, so I can be brave and then cry when they aren't looking?

I've packed their backpack with the things they'll need. There is a dinosaur lunchbox, new markers, and a face shield. There is a new laptop, hand sanitizer, and a box full of masks. There are bins full of food (so much food) and all the Lysol wipes it took me months to find. There is new corner of our house all ready for remote learning. This isn't the "back to school" I pictured, and I think we're all a little mad about it. Will you give us a gentle push when can't be brave on our own, and help us remember it's not REALLY the song on the car radio we're mad at?

I can't pack the most important things in the backpack though. There is no folder for making good choices, friendship, and healthy communication. There is no notebook for empathy, kindness, and how to say no. There is no special pen for hard lessons I wish they didn't have to learn about how to deal with stress, adversity, loss, and resilience. Will you help remind them that their own compass is better than any textbook?

The world feels SO scary right now for all of us. What if he gets sick, and I'm not there to hold his hand? What if she gets anxious, and I'm not there to remind her to take a deep breath? What if I don't know how to help through the moments of frustration on this computer screen? Who will greet them at the door after school to annoyingly ask how their first day was? What if the empty nest I've been quietly excited about suddenly feels too quiet? Will you sit with us both, wherever we are, and help us make through the moment?

Fold all of us in the folds of your skirt, Mama, help guide us through the chaos, so we don't get lost. Give us brave hearts, because we will need more courage than we ever have. Open our hearts and our hands to let them fly (even when we don't think we can). Fill our coffee cups, and make it strong. Remind us we're not alone (even when maybe we wish we were). Help me not to be a jerk to that parent whose choices I don't agree with, because someone feels the same way about me.

I don't know what I'm doing, but here we go.

# September Worship

The Volunteer-In-Missions trip planned for this October to Henderson Settlement in Kentucky, has been cancelled. This means that Calvary UMC has not been able to hold a VIM trip this year. We were hoping to do home repairs and other projects in this part of Appalachia as we did in the fall of 2019. Now we have decided not to go. There have not been any Covid-19 cases reported in the Henderson Settlement compound, but there may be some in the surrounding area. The staff was very understanding about our cancelation and wished us all well. They hope to see us again in 2021. The residents in the area are very cautious about 'outsiders or strangers' coming to their homes. Henderson is hopeful that attitude will be less in 2021. Lots of on campus and residential projects will be on the list for us next year should we go back.



Participants read a manageable 3-5 chapters of the Bible daily in preparation for the weekly meetings, which last approximately 75 minutes.

In Luke, Chapter 3; John the Baptist was warning the people to fear God's coming judgment. And what do you think their response was? Their answer was not an obedient we will do God's will but "What should we do then?" (vs 10)

An expected answer from those who want an easy out of being told what to do. John's answer was simple: "The man with two tunics should share with

him who has none, and the one who has food should do the same." (vs 11). Our fear and lack if security is to question of what do I do without my extra change of clothes when my only pair of pants gets dirty or wear a hole in the knee? How can I ask for the return of what I have given away to the needy? And my food from the pantry, what do I do when a friend who is greater to me than you visits and I lack enough to provide a meal? This call to generosity does not sound so simple after all – to share so much when you have so little.

John, and later Jesus, were using hyperboles to make the point of stewardship to have a great impact upon their listeners. The point is that we, as Christians, must always be mindful, and act in a fair and just manner toward others. We are to meet the needs of others when we have the ability to do so. The phrase "an opened hand" is meaningful when we perceive a need. This distills to having the grace in our heart that springs from the grace of the church's heart. The church's grace comes from grace in the heart of Christ and comes from the heart of God. Ultimately the grace of our heart reflects the grace of God's heart.


Even in the face of great difficulty, such as the Corona Virus, Calvary is still serving meals at the Soup Kitchen. While some things change in life, some things remain the same. In re-

sponse to closures, quarantines, and illness, there is still a need to feed the homeless and needy. We still make a meal. But now we provide chicken patties instead of our signature baked lemon-pepper chicken. We still provide corn, rice gravy and homemade coleslaw. We are grateful we have the means to continue this ministry to the needy.


Other change is that the people no longer eat in the dining hall – but now eat from carry out containers we pack and they eat in the street. Their comfort and life situation has thus deteriorated and a warm meal is welcomed. We include an additional 50 meals for those who have been quarantined at another facility. And the number of meals has increased. In the past we have served 70 to 100 people buffet and sit down style. Now we have been serving 150 meals with the Staff delivering 50 meals to those in quarantine.

The preparation of the meal still is the same; we only need a few to do it. However we have been starting to make the carry out meals at 3:30 or so and have finished about 6:00 pm. We need to have only 5 - 6 Calvary volunteers to do this part. We have not asked our regular volunteers to help since we do not serve the meal. It takes fewer people to prep and fill the meal containers.

So please do not feel ignored. We will call upon you as needed. We will be serving next **September 19<sup>th</sup>.**

I hope this letter finds you well and enjoying the last days of summer. As you know, we decided not to open the school this fall due to all the circumstances related to COVID-19 and the safety for both our staff

and families. I met with the steering committee as well as my staff, to decide if we wanted to revisit opening the school in January/February or to remain closed for the rest of the school year. This was a very difficult and emotional decision with many challenging questions and still many unknowns. Based on feedback from families, the steering committee and the staff we decided we will not open for the 2020-2021 school year and to focus on using this time to learn more about the current situation, problem solve ways to follow the current guidelines and develop our programs for the 2021-2022 school year. Families who are currently registered will receive a full refund or have the opportunity to pre-register for next year.

We appreciate your patience and understanding as we have worked through this very complex situation. The safety of both staff and families continue to be at the forefront of our decision-making and I remain hopeful for the 2021-2022 school year.
