We need to hug and be present with one another. We need to recall memories and hear stories about the ways that this person was part of our lives and the lives of others. And we need to be with others so that we can know that others are sharing in the loss we feel and helping us move forward in some new and healthy ways. We were not able to do this for so long and this has made the time much harder.

With a wonderful suggestion from the United Methodist Women, Cavalry Church will be providing a way to help people gather to remember, to celebrate and to grieve those who have died. There will be a memorial service for church members and those loved ones in our extended family who have died since March 2020. There will be music, scripture readings and prayers along with a brief sermon and time for friends and family of the deceased to share a few words. Following the service, the We Care Committee will provide food and refreshments in the Fellowship Hall to allow for the conversation and fellowship that they would normally provide after a funeral or memorial service held at the church.

I hope that you will join us as we celebrate the lives of those dear to us and give thanks to God for the ways that their lives have enriched the lives of others.

Organ Fund Update

Calvary is about half-way through its fund raising period for the new organ. The *Renew and Rejoice* program may seem to be stalled but there is a lot of activity behind the scene. Right now there seems to be a great deal of but little to see, touch or hear. Like faith in God, there is a great hope in the unseen.

With faith in the project, we can imagine standing with our church ancestors who envisioned and built this church building we worship in today. They too had hope in the final church building to come. The current organ is part of the build constructed 100 years ago. I can imagine their hopes to establish a church that would house prayer and song to God for a 1000 years. But organ pipes and valves do not last forever and repairs can only do so much. The organ is part of our worship as we honor God in heart and mind.

Our faith leads us to also hope for the unseen in this world that is part of God's creation with the same hope we have in God's promise of an eternal life. The organ does not compare to salvation, but both require faith in the unseen.

As I look forward to the time of a new reliable organ, I continue to meet my initial pledge. I hope to increase the amount, even if I must go beyond the remaining initial 18 months. It is a stewardship ministry that is important. I hope to be counted as one who picked up the fervor of the 1920's congregation and carry on their legacy by providing future generations of worshipers with an organ that leads in song and praise.

Throughout the scriptures, the principle of sacrifice is a consistent theme. In the Old Testament, God calls for any sacrifice to him to be the first fruit and the first born. Even the first born son, while redeemed was considered to be sacrificed to God.

We know the story of the widow at the temple, giv-

ing all that she had to God. And of course the sacrificial death of Jesus for our redemption. Barnabas gave up property as a sacrificial gift to the early church in Acts 4. Job and Jonah each sacrificed much at the call of God. There is something they all have in common. All gave up their gift willingly. Some initially were reluctant or questioning the call. They gave willingly in the end.

We recognize sacrificial giving as releasing from our control something of value and meaningful to us. Hebrews 13:16 reminds us "And do not forget to do good and to share with others, for with such sacrifices God is pleased." We find that God is pleased with our gift as he was with Abel's gift of his best lamb. But Cain's gift – a gift none the less- was not looked upon with favor by God. Why? We can only derive that the gifts were not the real problem. It was the attitude of the giver. Abel's gift was given from his heart in attitude that puts God foremost. He obeyed the command of the "best", unblemished gift. Cain did not have the attitude of Abel. Cain selected some of the fruits of the soil with little thought of faithful worship.

Another way to look at sacrificial giving in question its role in a true Christian disciple and steward's faith attitude. The concept of sacrificial giving is that the gift has some value. This implies that since the gift has value, or even great value to the giver. It is human nature to keep what is good and is of value. If not for a strong faith and fear of god, we would be inclined to keep the gift rather than give it away. The giver still has some attachment to the possession that has value in the world and is meaningful to the possessor. What is its value after this life?

Can the giver ever reach the point that any attachment to the gift is conquered? Attachment to any possession can be overcome by putting your faith life and your possessions into perspective that God has all and is all. God owns all and we owe all things to him. The gift is God's creation and is his ultimately. He has loaned it to us for our use as his stewards of his kingdom in this world.

Mark tells us: "To love him (God) with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." Mk 12:33 When we can do what Mark tells us, there is no "sacrifice" attached to your gift.
