As people of faith, we are commanded to love our neighbors as ourselves – even in ways that challenge who we might understand OUR NEIGHBORS to be.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON CLASS


What Did Jesus Really Say & Do (According to Mark)?

a Book Study on Rethinking what the Bible says about Homosexuality

- If you feel the church has been wrong to demonize and reject the LGBTQ community, but you're still pretty confident the Bible condemns homosexuality
- If you feel drawn to a more inclusive Christian faith but are held back by what you've been taught about the Bible.
- If you have close friends or family members who are gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender or queer and you love them with your whole heart, but your view of the Bible prevents you from fully celebrating them



- If you're an already affirming Christian but are still struggling to articulate what you believe about the clobber passages
- If you are LGBT or Q and you grew up in a Christian home or are drawn toward faith in Christ, but you have been told and maybe believe that God sees you as less-than, or despises you, or expects you to remain celibate or try and become straight

Stewardship Corner

Acts 16: 16-18 is the story of Paul and Silas' encounter with a female slave in Macedonia. While spreading the Good News in a certain town a female slave possessed by a spirit that allowed her to predict the future followed them. This is how she made a living, or more of a living for her masters. This must have been a great deal of income, as seen later, the loss of income has a drastic consequences for Paul and Silas.

For now let us focus on the female slave with the talent of telling the future. The slave girl was possessed by a spirit. We do not know at this point if the gift is for good or ill. God gives us all we need to do his work, this includes material possessions as well as gifts of the Spirit and talents to accomplish his will in furthering his kingdom. However, this female slave's talent of future telling was a gift that was not of the Spirit of God, but of the spirit of a demon. We know this because in v. 18, Paul eventually cast the spirit out of the slave after she followed them through the city for several days. Calling out to the people listening to Paul.

The interesting point is what she was saying to the people as she followed Paul and Silas was the truth: "These men are servants of the Most High God, who are telling you the way to be saved." (v.17) Why would Paul silence the truth? Because the truth was being used by Satan and his minions to thwart the will of God by interfering with the mission and ministry of Paul and Silas.

Satan and his demons do use and will use the truth about God to misdirect and subvert the word of God and our understanding of the Word. Satan's effort is to corrupt Paul's work and our work so that it does not bear good fruit. As exampled by the words of the snake to Eve in Genesis and Satan's words to Jesus in the three temptations in the wilderness. So in this case, the slave girl's truth was preventing Paul's work to continue.

It is up to use to discern the use of out talents. When we use our talents to bear good fruit in the name of God, we are righteous in his eyes. And we will have success. When that same talent is not from God, but from the realms of evil, we must either give up that talent, or transform ourselves to God – repent and do his will by doing the good that furthers his kingdom and not the kingdom of the demonic.
