

Making a difference, upcoming volunteer event

The Missions Committee and Church and Society Committees are sponsoring monthly volunteer projects to benefit people in need both close to home and far away. Each month, there will be a "hands on" event that will allow people from our congregation to focus on a specific need. The projects don't require any particular skills or ongoing commitment. They are designed to be an easy way for folks to offer a bit of their time to make the world a little better than before. (Lord knows, there are lots of ways to make things worse).



Each event is a great way to do something meaningful for others, learn about a need, and get to know some folks from the congregation. This is a great way to be the "hands and feet of Christ." It is also a way of serving Christ by serving others. (Take a look at Matthew 25:34-40.) All we ask is for people to sign up to let us know you're interested and then show up. (Sometimes a waiver is also required)

We started this with a CROP Walk to raise funds for Ukraine relief in April. In June there will be a "bed building event" with the organization, Sleep in Heavenly Peace. This is a follow up to the efforts done through the children's Sunday School class. We hope to have about 30 people involved to prepare and assemble beds for children in Frederick County who lack an adequate bed. Other events planned for the fall include a meal packaging in partnership with the organization Rise Against Hunger and home repair day for a family in in partnership with Habitat for Humanity of Frederick County.

On Tuesday, May 24, we will be taking a group to Mission Central in Mechanicsville, PA. Mission Central is a Christian mission organization that opened in 2002 to work closely with United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) has other organizations to offer other services and recourses.

In 2020, Mission Central served over 3.3 million people with over \$10.9 million in donated resources including medical supplies and equipment, disaster relief, school supplies, food, and provided PPE for hospitals, first responders, and educators. Eighty percent of the resources were used domestically and 20% were sent overseas. Each year, Mission Central hosts between 6,000 and 8,000 volunteers in the campus.

Our volunteer event will leave Frederick at 11:00 AM and return by 4:30 PM. We hope to take group of 10 to 12 people to work in the Mission Central warehouse to packaging items for flood/cleaning kits, school kits, or hygiene kits to be sent where there is a natural disaster or other need. Arrangements will be made for transportation and lunch for those who participate. To learn more or to sign up, see the bulletin and our weekly emails.

This is a reminder that Christian discipleship involves what we do with our hands and feet. I hope you will plan to join in the volunteer efforts that will be offered now and, in the months to come.

Resurrection closer to home: The church in mission

As Easter people of the Christian faith, entering the period leading to Pentecost and the birth of the church (Acts 2), we turn now to the question that faced the earliest disciples and other followers of Jesus, namely, what is the meaning for us of this divine outcome, the resurrection of Jesus? The Apostle Paul would speak of it as a spiritual new life for those who belief in and commit their lives to Christ Jesus (2 Cor 5:17). From the Book of Acts and the Epistles to the early church, we know that the new life in Christ took the form of Jesus' declaration of His own mission here on earth (Mt 20: 28; and Lk 4: 16-21).

If we as disciples at Calvary are to follow the lead of the earliest disciples, therefore, we are called to become people with a renewed spiritual life in Christ, reaching out in His ministry to those in need or otherwise marginalized in our communities. In that spirit this year, as we enter a "new normal" period following a two-year virus pandemic, the mercy and justice ministries at Calvary are working together with Pastor Steve and Jackie Stranathan, our Discipleship Coordinator, to seek new ways of doing the Lord's work. Of being a church in His mission.

In this endeavor, we seek multi-generational opportunities to engage in fellowship as we serve others, to employ the diversity of gifts and interests with which we have been blessed, while also recognizing the various limitations of our personal life conditions. Examples of these possibilities are: volunteering to be helpers for Calvary-hosted Red Cross blood drives; working on projects with Habitat for Humanity; helping collect food for Frederick food banks; helping build and furnish beds for children who have no place to sleep; planning new mission visits to the Henderson Settlement in Kentucky; sponsoring a work day at our nearby Manidokan church camp; or making financial contributions in support of special local, national, or global ministries.

As plans develop for these and other opportunities for witness to our faith in Christ, notices will be placed in our weekly church bulletins. *But for such ministries to occur, we must have volunteers!* If you know already that you would like to help in any of these or other possible ministries, or even help us plan for the same, please contact Jackie Stranathan, Pat Herber, Helen Sheppard, or me. Otherwise, please prayerfully consider in what type of ministry to others, and in what manner, you would like to participate in the year ahead and let us know. Remember the words written to God's people in the Letter of James (2:18): "I will show you my faith by my actions."

<u>Stewardship Corner</u>

What is the cost of discipleship? In Luke 14: 28-34, Jesus tells a parable about the cost of living a faithful life. The first example us about a builder who is starting a tower. It is told that the builder must "sit down" and estimate the full cost to its completion. The builder is to plan the tower's construction and calculate the cost required to complete the tower.

What is the tower builder ready to spend to complete the tower? He has other things he could do with his wealth. Is the tower within his means? Does he have enough to do the foundation and a hope to have enough to finish the rest? This leads us to Jesus' point of how important is the tower to the builder. Jesus' real point is how important to you is achieving the promise kingdom?

The second example that Jesus uses is about a king who weighs the cost of opposing a stronger army. Can he afford the risk of defeat or should he sue for peace before the battle is engaged? What is it he has to lose and what is it he hopes to gain by his decision of course of action? What will you lose as a disciple if you do not want to accept the cost?

While these two parables reflect material issues, both have their real meaning in a spiritual understanding. The cost to be considered is what is ultimately an obstacle that hinders total allegiance to Christ? The tower builder; the cost is dictated by the expense to full completion. Would he be willing to give all he has or only a small portion of his wealth? The king; would he be willing to lose a large part of his army or even the loss of his entire kingdom?

How does this compare to the disciples called by Jesus immediately leaving their nets and following Jesus. How much was each of them willing to give in their actions in response to his call? The same question is asked of you; would you be willing to give a little of yourself, or would you go so far as total allegiance and obedience? Would you be willing to give a small amount of your material wealth, oh – up to ten percent or as the widow at the temple, all she had?
