We will ponder the spaces we inhabit at home, work, and community, asking whether they are feeding, nurturing, and reflecting the freedom and joy that is so desperately needed.

December 25 (Sunday) Christmas Day Surprisingly Sacred

Isaiah 52: 7-10 and John 1: 1-14

In the early church, Sunday was known as the "day of light." And so, it is special when Christmas falls on a Sunday, as it does this year. As light dawns on this morning, as the children scramble to the tree to see what has appeared, we remember that the sacred often comes in the form of surprise, just as it did when light and life was known in the form of a baby born in a humble stable.

It is the Christmas season! Our senses and awareness are heightened toward good will, loving others, care for the sharing the gifts we have been given needy and hope that all God's promises come to completion.

We cherish the Christmas the story of Christ's birth in the second chapter of Luke and in Matthew. There are thousands of uplifting seasonal stories movies and songs. We will hear sermons and homilies on the real meaning of Christ's birth and God's love for us. It is a love so great that Jesus is God's gift of self to us. It is a gift showing the way to salvation and eternal life. What a story!

At the end of the Christmas season, what happens to us? This feeling of Christian love, while still present, seems to be put away until next year. We know that Jesus did not want us to become complacent in our Christian living.

The need then is to look deeply into ourselves. How can we make this different? We can express our Christian love by serving and caring for others throughout the year with time, talent and even our money.

As the shepherds and Magi came to worship the new born Jesus, they went away to spread the Good News. They did not keep the event to themselves. We can follow their example through our "worship" of god by intentional and continuous service, care and love for those near us.

We have lifted up those who have committed themselves to making beds for children in need of their own place to sleep. In the past we have served through the Lord's laundry and the soup kitchen those in need and without. We give to the Frederick Food Bank each month through the wheel barrow ministry. Some of us go on mission trips. There are others who just give and give.

Jesus uses the word "GO". Go and serve where and when you can. Those who lack the time or ability to be a hands-on volunteer - take stock of your financial means and become a generous giver. Re-evaluate your commitment to the Church you made last month. If not doing so, start to include gifting to the Communion or Mission Outreach Fund.

The Communion Fund is a local giving that supports the emergency need of own members and our nearest neighbor. It was recently used to contribute to UMCOR hurricane relief. The Mission Outreach is used to support needs in the world that are before us. These a pressing needs that relieve spiritual and physical needs and suffering.

Consider how you can employ the Christian Christmas season of love. Pick one thing and do it, through your stewardship service of talent, witness, and generous giving.

Love came down at Christmas

It seems as though God's love is our most needed gift at Christmas each year, given the rather continuously troubled world in which we live, certainly within our own nation as well. So too it was at the time of Jesus' birth under the reign of the Roman empire. "Many in first-century Palestine ... as in every time since ...were looking for political deliverance," wrote Michael Gerson in his *Washington Post* editorial on December 25, 2020. ... "Instead ... the birth of Jesus points to a power found in vulnerability, service and humility. Humankind is offered not a new way of organizing human society but a new way of being human, marked by compassion, purpose, dignity and kindness."

Certainly the peace on earth foretold by the angelic messengers to the lonely and lowly shepherds on that first Christmas (*Lk 2:8-14*) had in mind the justice and mercy for all humans that God intended through the earthly life and death of His son Jesus; justice and mercy based upon human compassion, humility, and service, honoring the dignity and worth of all humans. In his introductory remarks to *John Wesley for the 21st Century* (2006, p. 6), John Gooch states: "For Wesley, above all, the key to religion was found in the answer to the question, 'How does one live a holy life in front of God? ... It's not just 'talking the talk' about God and our relationship with God, it's also 'walking the walk.'" As Jesus taught us through His disciples, we are to love God and our neighbor through actions of justice and mercy, humbly serving those in poverty or otherwise marginalized in human society. Bryan Stevenson, Executive Director of Equal Justice Initiative and author of *Just Mercy*, preaches that the opposite of poverty is not wealth, but justice.

In the months ahead in our new year, I will share with you and invite your participation in a number of ways within which Calvary's outreach mission ministry continues and plans to serve those in need within our immediate and geographic distant communities. As we prepare during the Advent season for the re-birth of Jesus in our hearts, having also just made our financial stewardship pledges for the new year, may each of us in addition prayerfully reflect and act upon how we might commit ourselves to Calvary's outreach mission ministries in the year ahead.

This month, December 2022, if the official end of the *Renew and Rejoice* Organ replacement capital improvement project. We are almost there. There is good news in the almost all have completed and are about to complete their pledges to the Organ Fund. There are rumors of more good news. The new organ is being built as Joyce Summers has kept us up to date. As of November 15th we have collected \$974,730. We only have \$23,000. This is makeable!

We thank all who have completed their commitment. You have lead us to within a cat's whisker of our goal. I hope you all feel in your heart a peace and joy that you felt God's call and have met it. I truly believe the Spirit of God has been upon you.

The building portion of *Renew and Rejoice* started last August with the de-construction of the old organ and the start of refurbishment of some of the old pipes. We hope to have the new organ installed sometime in the summer of 2023. This gives us a surprising opportunity to continue to contribute to the organ fund. Some of our members have said that they wish to continue to support future maintenance expenses.

Well done, yes, well done indeed.
