We are pleased to announce that Calvary United Methodist Church will be providing a church-wide study for all ages on Wednesday evening during the Lenten season starting on Wednesday, March 1.

This year, the hope is that this might be an intergenerational experience that brings different people together with activities that everyone can enjoy and grow together. Thank you, Calvary!

Due to your generosity this recent Christmastide, youth in our community who are homeless or otherwise without a regular residence will have access to personal hygiene items through the services of the Student Homelessness Initiative Partnership (SHIP) working in collaboration with the Frederick County Public Schools. Calvary was among the many churches, synagogues, and other local organizations contributing to this annual service by SHIP for our youth, a service without which many youth might drop out of school or other activities important for their personal development. Thank you, thank you, Calvary!

"Sleep in heavenly peace" ...

... so concludes the first verse of Franz Gruber's beautiful carol, Silent Night, traditionally sung at the conclusion of Christmas Eve candlelight services ... often at a time when the secular nightcap for children that evening goes something to the effect of "all tucked in their beds, while visions of sugar plums danced in their heads." Sadly, not only worldwide but in our own country, yes, even in Frederick County, there are far too many children who have no beds of their own into which they might be snugly tucked at night!

To address this problem, an organization of volunteers, known as Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP), was launched over a decade ago in Idaho, beginning in a garage and now with chapters in most states and Canada. With the leadership of Pat and Dave Herber, Helen Sheppard, and Beth Stitely, Calvary's Mission Ministry Team has enabled Calvary to become involved in this service with our county chapter for about a year. Some of our adults and youth will recall our engagement as a congregation last June to sponsor and prepare the parts for 20 bunk beds with the guidance of our county SHP organization at its converted dairy barn on Rt. 85 near the Adamstown Road. Our Calvary Sunday School children also contributed on that occasion by collected new twin sized bedding for the bunks for their Lenten mission project. Again, this spring, we will be providing financial support as well as labor to build 20 more beds in the Adamstown barn. *Save the date, Thursday evening, May 4th for this opportunity*. More details will be provided closer to that time for folks to volunteer.

Free of charge, beds with brand new bedding are provided for children 4-17. Last year the Frederick chapter of SHP delivered 1,119 beds. On a weekly basis currently, a group of 4-5 Calvary folks have been delivering beds and bedding to children and youth in need. We have delivered over 100 beds to date, and typically complete 3 home deliveries in an evening, The teams meet in our church parking lot at about 4:30 p.m. and are usually finished by about 7:30 p.m. Our delivery team greets the families in their homes, assembles the bunk beds, and make the beds with fresh linens and bedding. The smiles on the faces and other expressions of joy from the children, youth, and adults thus served are the rewards received! In as much as we maintain an inventory in Calvary's garage from which to make deliveries, we are also in need of volunteers with pickup trucks to help us maintain that inventory from local warehouses. Thus, there are a number of ways in which we might participate in this wonderful opportunity for Christian witness and fellowship. 
