#### From the Pastor

Throughout the summer, annual conferences in the United Methodist Churches around the country were holding their annual meetings. Among reports and budgets, worship, Bible study, ordination and debates, each annual conference took action on those congregation that had completed a process to remove themselves from The United Methodist Church. According to the General Conference action in 2019, congregations had a limited right to disaffiliate from the denomination for reasons of conscience regarding a change in the requirements and provisions of the Book of Discipline related to the practice of homosexuality or the ordination or marriage of self-avowed practicing homosexuals. A congregation could separate themselves from the UMC and still retain their property and assets so long as they met all the requirements. The window for completing this process has now been closed in all but a handful of cases.

For three plus years, it was uncertain just how many congregations would disaffiliate. Now we know. About one-fifth of congregation in the U.S. have completed the process. 6,240 congregations out of 30,543 in the U.S. There are approximately another 12,000 congregations world-wide. Many of the churches that have left are concentrated in the Southeast. In the Baltimore Washington Conference of approximately 600 churches, 25 congregations have disaffiliated. You can see a chart that shows disaffiliations by annual conferences.

I wish God's blessings on each of the church's that disaffiliated. I have worked with some of the clergy and members from these churches. These are our brothers and sisters and they will reach people that UM congregations may not reach. But I'm proud to be remaining in the United Methodist.

I am excited about the future seems to hold, both in this congregation and the larger church. We are busy engaging in mission and outreach projects, seeing guests coming to worship services, baptizing and welcoming new people into membership and offering a word of hope and love each day and week.

I got a call last week from someone moving into Frederick. They wanted to know "what kind of United Methodist Church" Calvary was. I told them that we are a church that is

- committed to the gospel as contained in the Bible and historic creeds,
- committed to welcoming and showing love to all persons, both members and those who are outside the church,
- and we are interested in building a community of love and forgiveness, witness and service in response to Christ's call on our lives.
- Here we may not all think alike, look alike, or vote alike, but we can all worship the One Lord and we follow God's direction and guidance with the Spirit's help.

## Adult Sunday Study Group To Re-Start

Last year a new Sunday morning study group for adults was launched, led by Paul Nelson. In addition to use of the Bible, each study was also guided by publications of pastors or other scholars of the Bible, each raising questions for discussion.

That class will begin weekly meetings again starting Sunday September 10 at 9am in the small conference room of the church office building (that faces West Second Street but entry to which is best made from the patio between the Sanctuary and office buildings off Calvary's rear parking lot). So, if you are not already engaged in a Sunday morning class, and would like to become involved in a small group informal discussion of biblical themes, grab a cup of coffee and pastry in Parish Hall and join us ... or join us without the coffee and pastry!

Whether you have never been in a class studying the Bible or have been in one or another virtually all of your adult life, this class is for you! There is no pre-requisite! We all learn together!

Our first study this year will be Adam Hamilton's *Making Sense of the Bible: Rediscovering the Power of Scripture Today.* Hamilton, a well-known author, is lead pastor of one of our nation's largest United Methodist Churches.

Originally formed to provide music at Trinity church's Christmas Eve worship services, the group continues to participate in worship services at its own home church. Over the years, The Trinity Brass has provided sacred and secular music entertainment for a wide assortment of groups in the Frederick, Maryland and greater Washington, DC areas. Past performances have included music at several of the United Methodist churches in the B-W Annual Conference, but also at local civic and scouting groups, different assisted living facilities, the Veteran's Administration Medical Center in Martinsburg, West Virginia, and at Annual Banquets of the International Order of Odd Fellows in Arlington, Virginia. They have provided their musical talents at Harry Grove Stadium in Frederick, Maryland by playing the *National Anthem* at the start of Frederick Keys minor league baseball games.

The Trinity Brass has selected and participated in the National Park Service's Annual "National Christmas Tree Music Program" for several years, providing seasonal music entertainment to the visitors of the National Christmas Tree on the ellipse in Washington, DC.

The Trinity Brass participated in the United Methodist 2016 General Conference in Portland, Oregon in May, which was the group's first performance for an international audience.

# Stewardship

In addition to Jesus telling his followers, in Matthew, that they are the "salt of the earth', he tells us "You are the light of the world" (Matt 5:14). The apostle John describes Jesus as being the light that was life (John 1:5) and the "true light that gives light to everyone" (vs. 9) If Jesus is the true light, it is important for us to understand why he tells us, we too, are the light. When we know this we can live in faith as that light to, and in the world.

We are the reflective light of Christ as the moon is reflecting light from the sun upon the earth. We are that light when we live a faith filled and holy life that reflects the character of God and the way Christ lived while on earth. Like a lamp that lights a room, we can show others, who are struggling in the dark and corrupted and corrupting world. We can cast light upon the truth about worldly temptations with unseen pitfalls. We can live a life in peace and mercy from God that leads to a better way in relationship with Him and His Son, Christ. Psalm 18:28 reads "You, Lord, are my lamp; the Lord turns my darkness into light." We can turn darkness into light for others.

We can practice generosity and kindness to others by eschewing our own selfish motives and desires. A way of self-control that shows those in need that they can be the same in practice. A light dispels darkness. We who live in the light do not need to act like the world, material gain, is the most important god in our life.

# **Henderson Settlement Update**

Calvary United Methodist Church (CUMC) completed a very successful and rewarding Mission Outreach journey to Henderson Settlement in Frakes KY July 16-22, 2023. With 8 Youth Ministry members accompanied by 2 chaperones, and the 6 person Adult Team, we completed several challenging projects. The Youth Team demo'd the Henderson Youth Education Center kitchen cabinets, built all new cabinets, painted the stairwell, power washed and stained the 2-story deck, painted the side of a building, and built a cement basketball pad. At the same time the Adult Team renovated a living room and entry as well as attaching facial siding and soffit to the exterior of an elderly couple's trailer home, and then installed the new kitchen cabinets in the Youth Education Center. As rewarding as these projects were, we were also very proud of our Youth Team for conducting the morning devotions Tuesday. We sang a special "Henderson" rendition of Amazing Grace written by Helen Shepherd which touched everyone present. Throughout the week, we felt the presence of God in the work we did for those in need, the collaboration of our Teams, and the appreciation of the beauty of the Kentucky mountain countryside. The CUMC Mission funding of \$4300 allowed us to have the materials and resources needed to do our work. Thank you to all who supported this important Mission Outreach program either by being part of our 16 person Team or financially. We look forward to our next Mission Outreach journey – stay tuned
