Homeless for the holidays ... children and youth at risk

The holidays celebrated in December by those of us who are relatively privileged in this world are typically characterized by the gathering of family and friends in warm homes for fellowship, the exchange of gifts, and the enjoyment of more than enough good food. Sadly, such is not the case for so many in this troubled world. For many reasons of both human making and natural disasters, homeless refugee populations, including children and youth, around the world and including our nation's borders, represent one of the greatest humanitarian challenges of our day. Indeed, we often forget that the birth of Jesus with his temporary home a stable, followed shortly thereafter fleeing as a refugee with his family to Egypt to escape death at the hands of a tyrannical ruler, is such an instance!

In addition to refugees at our national border, far too many people are also homeless within our nation's cities, towns, and rural communities. We often see homeless adults on our streets and in tent camps, or hearing about them through community shelters and media. Less apparent are the children and youth who are homeless or otherwise in need within our community. Families with children in such circumstances are helped by the *Religious Coalition* of Frederick that Calvary supports financially. But even among children and youth in homes, many are in such low-income families that they lack their own beds, a need Calvary helps address in partnership with the national organization *Sleep in Heavenly Peace* through financial and volunteer support to build and deliver beds. Our congregation led by our youth group also ensures nutritious food options for these youth over weekends when not in school through *Blessings in a Backpack*.

In similar manner, **during this holiday season**, we are collecting personal hygiene items for homeless youth as well as clothing and other gifts for youth and children of low-income families in need through the **Homeless for the Holidays** and **Angel Tree** projects, coordinated respectively with *SHIP (Student Homelessness Initiative Partnerships)* and jointly the *Religious Coalition* and *Salvation Army*. Notices about each of these projects and our monthly collection of food for the community food pantry will be in the Sunday worship bulletins.

Please give generously as you can, sharing God's love for our children and youth in special need during this holiday season as we celebrate the birth of Jesus.

A former Calvary Pastor had a personal tradition of reading "A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens each Christmas Season. One year he presented an Advent Study of its theological themes.

My personal tradition is to eat as many cookies as I can, and re-read the Scriptures that foretell and tell of Christs coming and birth. There are many characters important to the story. Mary and Joseph had a major part in the story. Herod in his fear of a rival and maybe a rebellion had his role. A deadly one to the Jewish people. There is the innkeeper that allowed the use of his animal stall and the manger for a crib we sing about. The Magi, three wise men from somewhere east to bring gifts in worship. We tend to forget the idea of gift giving was an act of worship at the beginning.

This year, my mind kept returning to the shepherds watching over their flocks at night. Luke word paints a picture of stillness and deep quiet. A time of darkness in time and in spirit. How was this night any different than all the previous ones? The heavens full of light, glorious singing and angels too many to count. I can relate to their attitude toward what is routine in life; the routine being disrupted by something unexpected. This is what I kept thinking about as I read Luke 2: 8-20 for the third time. We too are focused on our lives and making it through each day. We tend to overlook, over-ignore, and overly discount what is happening around to us. This is the time to remember God is with you in these times as He was with the shepherds in their dark and cold time.

Luke describes how God abruptly entered their world. An angel of the Lord appeared with the glory of the Lord all around them. Fear griped their hearts. An angel of good word –"Do not be afraid" and news of a birth of a Savior, Christ the Lord. I can imagine the response of the shepherds. The sight and sounds must have been over whelming. But they heard and understood. They took courage with each other and obeyed the word to come and see the child and the truth of God's spoken word. We here the call of come see. Do we obey?

Think of a child on Christmas morning opening their gift to find something wonderful that was hidden from their eyes. That feeling is yours too as we come to see Christ out of our own darkness and fears. We open God's no more hidden gift of Jesus Christ, His Son and our savior.

Update from Sleep in Heavenly Peace:

We are most grateful to the church community for your ongoing support of Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP). So far in 2023, we have provided the funding and labor for the building of 20 beds. With our weekly delivery team, we have assembled and delivered over 200 new beds to local children.
