

2024 Lenten Study



All four Gospels provide an account of the last days of Jesus. They include stories of failure and courage despair and hope, political machinations, and theological inspiration. The meaning of the stories grows as we learn the history and contexts behind the words of the Gospels. As we look at the history and literature of the Passion accounts, we can find ways to understand our own lives through the stories, trials and choices of Jesus. This Lenten season, we can be challenged to examine our conscience and find that our own relationship with Jesus and the Bible bring us into closer relationship with others and the world.

In <u>Entering the Passion of Jesus: A Beginner's Guide to Holy Week</u>, popular author, professor, and biblical scholar <u>Amy-Jill Levine</u> explores the biblical texts surrounding the Passion story. She shows us how the text raises ethical and spiritual questions for the reader, and how we all face risk in our Christian experience.

There will be a meal offered each Wednesday at 6:00 PM. This is a great time for fellowship and sharing with others.

The program study will start promptly at 6:45 PM and wrap up by 7:45 PM. Each program will involve a presentation to the whole group as well as table discussion and individual reflection.

We are entering the Lenten season with Ash Wednesday midmonth and marching (pardon the pun) on to Easter Sunday, the last Sunday of March. Some of us, Easter People, practice fasting during the time of Lent.

Fasting is a practice of giving up something that is of importance to us personally.

Does chocolate, coffee, or meat come to mind? The purpose of fasting is to help us focus on the sacrifice of God, he gave us his only son to death, and Jesus Christ's sacrifice of His life, for our own salvation. What we sacrifice are worldly things that are meaningful to us – yet in heavenly things mean nothing.

Fasting is practiced to remind us of our relationship with God. How important to us is He? Isaiah 58 tells us about fasting. Isaiah speaks for God is describing the fast of the Israelites that has become imperfect. They has lost the true meaning of the fast. On the day of fasting they "...do as you please and exploit all your workers.' They quarreled and fought with others. In other words, they and by implication —we, do not change our thinking from worldly to heavenly things when fasting. We are more concerned with "what" we give up than "why" we give up.

In verse 5, God says through Isaiah: "Is this the kind of fast I have chosen, **only a day** for people to humble themselves?' (emphasis mine). To God the act of fasting is a means to personal reflection of your spiritual condition. The greater part of Chapter 58 describes true fasting as "loose the chains of injustice, ...set the oppressed free, ...share your food with the hungry, ...provide the poor wanderer with shelter, ...not turn away from your own flesh and blood, ...". These are Christ like acts that God calls us to engage in our daily living. We should be doing these things daily. Fasting is a means to remember we are doing the sacrifices of self because of our relationship with God.

Besides the feeling of accomplishment and recognition of self will power, there are spiritual benefits. If you fast a true fast, God's blessing will be heaped upon you in abundance that is beyond imagination. Note the importance of the quantity and quality of the blessings. They are from God and are in abundance and beyond anything we could ever hope.

Thank you so much for the benefits of the "Bake-a-Batch" fundraiser/ Cookie sale. It is amazing to know that my Church Family remembered my contribution to the Nursery. Thank you also goes to those people in the congregation that bought them.

My rehab lacked in 2023 but, I'm planning on a speech pathologist in 2024. The funds donated should DEFINITELY help me to have a conversation with members, without a translator.

I hope to soon return to the Nursery. While I can't do what I used to, at least I can see the evolution of the Nursery.

Bookends of our faith ...

The introductory and concluding chapters are the bookends of a good novel. To understand them, however, one must read what the former news commentator Paul Harvey referred to as "the rest of the story." So it is also with our Christian faith. To best understand the meaning of the Old Testament and the New Testament Books of Acts, Letters, and Revelation, one must read and understand the gospels, the heart of the Christian Bible. Even within the gospels, however, our faith is often defined by the birth, death and resurrection of Jesus, the alpha and omega of his human life, the celebration of which is our Christmas and Easter experience.

And now we come to Lent, a period between those celebratory bookends, a period of reflection and repentance in our relationship with God through Jesus the Christ. The question I ask of myself each Lent, and ask of you at this time, is about the focus of our reflections and repentance. Are we focused on such matters as our sinfulness and salvation, guided by such scriptures as John 3:16 or Romans 8:1-4 and 10:5-10? Or are we focused on how our faith is translated into action guided by such scriptures as Mathew 22:37-40, Mark 8:34-35 or James 2:14-18?

My own reflection is that both of these orientations are essential to Christian discipleship, that one without the other is insufficient to be a follower of Jesus. We come together each week to worship God in the fellowship of the Holy Spirit; but does our weekly faith journey begin and end there? Or do we faithfully engage also daily or weekly in studying the scriptures, alone or in prayer and devotional groups of one form or another? And beyond strengthening our faith in these ways, how engaged are we in mercy and justice outreach in the community, a witness to our faith through action?

Calvary offers many opportunities for growth in discipleship through all of the above venues, alerting us always to such opportunities through our weekly worship bulletins and email notices, our monthly newsletter, our website, and handouts available in Parish Hall. My prayer for this Lent is that we continue to grow as disciples of Jesus in fellowship with one another, that our faith not be defined only by bookends but also by the Message in between.


