

### **Sleep In Heavenly Peace**

Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) is an all-volunteer organization that builds and delivers beds, complete with mattresses, sheets, blankets, and pillows, free of charge, to needy children. The motto is: "No kid sleeps on the floor in our town!" The national organization recently celebrated its 10-year anniversary. Over the past 6 years, the Frederick County chapter has built and delivered nearly 2,000 beds. And yes, the need is still out there in our community.

Calvary Church has partnered with this organization several very significant ways:

- We have contributed financially. It cost \$250 for the lumber, mattress, pillow, sheets and bedspread for each bed.
- We provide a room in the Education Building to store bedding donated for the entire chapter and space in the garage for beds that are ready to be delivered.
- Our Mission Possible Kids have been breaking down lots (and lots) of cardboard, sorting donated bedding and making thank you notes.
- Our church has a weekly delivery team led by Dave and Pat Herber. We have delivered on over 70 evenings totaling over 370 beds since June 2022.
- We have provided many volunteers to build the beds. For the third year, Calvary is sponsoring a special evening bed build of 20 beds. The event takes place at a barn near Buckeystown. This year our sponsored bed build will be on May 9<sup>th</sup> from 5 to 7 pm to complete 20 beds. There are jobs for all skill levels. We will end the evening with some time for fellowship and ice cream donated by Rocky Point Creamery. We encourage anyone who wants to just check out what we're doing to stop a bit after 6 pm for some ice cream. Bring your lawn chair to enjoy the farm and nice weather. This year Calvary has received a grant to support Calvary's involvement with Sleep in Heavenly Peace. With the addition of these funds, we are able to sponsor both the evening build on May 9 and underwrite the cost of another set of beds on May 18<sup>th</sup>. We welcome your help with the build on May 18<sup>th</sup> also. That build will be open to volunteers from the community.



### Eastertide reflections on the passion of Jesus

During this 40-day post-Easter period prior to Pentecost, we reflect on the meaning for our lives of Jesus' resurrection following his death on the Roman cross. Such reflection was certainly experienced among those who were his earliest followers, however varied they may have been in their understanding of his identity and earthly mission in the context of the ancient Hebrew understanding of the Messiah and the "end of times," as well as their cyclical history of domination and freedom from one empire or another for centuries. The Apostle Paul in his letters to the early church as well as the four gospel writers each attended significantly in different ways to the resurrection of Jesus, often considered today as the defining event of the Christian faith.

Much as Professor Amy Jill Levine discussed in our Lenten study book *Entering the Passion of Jesus*, Professors Marcus Borg and John Crosson in their book *The Last Week* discuss the religious, political, and personal risks Jesus faced in the final days of his journey to the cross. Borg and Crosson also discuss two understandings of the word "passion." In Christian theological contexts the word is most often thought of in terms of the sacrificial suffering Jesus endured for the sake of humankind; but, as Borg and Crosson point out, the word "passion" in everyday English also connotes extreme devotion to something or someone. In the context of his earthly ministry, they identify that passion of Jesus as the *Kingdom of God*.

Jesus' concept of that Kingdom was not of this world (John 18:36) as ancient Israelites may have hoped, Temple authorities may have questioned, or as the Roman governors may have feared. Rather, it was to be a spiritual and earthly quality of the human heart of which God spoke through the prophet Jeremiah (31:31-33). The Kingdom of which Jesus spoke is only possible when we love God with all our heart, soul, and mind; and love our neighbor as ourselves. Yet, it is not enough for Jesus that we know this in our mind and feel it in our heart; rather, he challenges us even today to carry out that love in our actions (Mk 12: 28-34). It is such we seek praying for God's kingdom here on earth in the Lord's Prayer.

Through Jesus' parables and other teachings, his focus was largely on this earthly life and how we live it, a life of justice and mercy, of sharing God's grace and love with others of all backgrounds, especially those marginalized in society. It was this theme of God's Kingdom that inspired more than a century ago the classic social justice and mercy treatise by the Rev. Walter Rauschenbush, *Christianity and the Social Crisis in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century,* and the initial publication of what today are the United Methodist *Social Principles.* 

Where do we stand in each of our own understandings of the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus and its meaning for our lives? What does the Kingdom of God mean to us? Might Jesus say to us: "Why do you call me 'Lord, Lord,' but do not do as I say?" (Lk 6:46)



### Stewardship Corner

The Ephesian church congregation was having difficulty in shedding old habits. Prior to their individual acceptance of the "way", as preached by Paul, and joining together as a home church in Ephesus, their actions were based on self at the expense of neighbor. It was the typical zero sum game of I win you lose. This is the same trap of failure to live a Christian life we can slip into today as a false feel good habit. It sometimes is costly to join others in Christian living. By looking at Paul's next words in Ephesians, we can see the traps that may await us.

Paul's instructions on how to handle these potential failings speak to lying and fostering rumors, anger management of self and sub-coming to destructive temptations. An important instruction deals with Christian character when you are poor or in need. When you have little, do you allow envy and greed to be the primary emotional response – leading to destructive temptation or do you respond to Paul's words that echo the commandment from God: Do not steal! Stealing can be gaining an unfair advantage over another. Remember the Pharisees were accused of stealing the homes of widows.

In Ephesians 4: 28; Paul says "Anyone who has been stealing must steal no longer…" Theft springs from want. There is something you crave that is a <u>must</u> have because of \_\_\_\_\_ (you fill it in). It is a failure of self-control or will to do what you know is right and but do what is wrong.

Paul's remedy is to work, refocus from stealing (an unproductive act) to a productive action. He continues: "doing something useful with their own hands..." In today's society our labor is exchanged for identified value to replace what is gained by stealing. The Christian value of "work" to enhance one's circumstances, by self-gratifying means. Hard work produces personal satisfaction without guilt and recrimination. Hard work raises your status as a contributor to society.

The result of working with your own hands is not singular. It gives each a feeling of a healthy self – mentally and physical being. There are a multitude of studies that support this state of being. Paul gives us a Christian perspective. Hard work gives us the ability to share something with other in need. This is the Christian value of generosity, based on hard work. The more you have earned the more you have to give for the greater good.
