There is a lot at stake these days. Divisiveness and fear are being stirred up to create ratings and popular support. We are bombarded with messages that divide us and undermine our trust. How does our faith in Christ equip us to survive, and even thrive spiritually, in this moment? This seems to be the perfect time to talk about "doing unto others" in ways that foster kindness, compassion, humility, respect, and love.

We don't have all the "answers" that can make us feel in control of our situations. But what we DO have are the teachings of Jesus–also someone who lived in turbulent times–to help us know what matters most. He invited us to focus on what a world would be like if we treated others in

incredibly generous ways. Caring for one another, even those with different views, is at the core of our faith.

We are called to gather around the Light of Christ and remember how Jesus called together friends and foes and offered the grace and love of God to all people.

I know this can be a scary proposition, but what if the church could model coming together to care for one another in the midst of what feels like so much hate and distrust? The word "revolution" originated from a word defined as "finding a course around a central point." What if we could have a "revolution of kindness" with Christ as the center? If we can't do it here and now, where and when "for God's sake" will we?

The Church of the Resurrection in Kansas City and Marcia McFee of the Worship Design Studio have provided resources for churches to hold a campaign for kindness in the weeks just before the national election. This involves a worship series called "Do Unto Other."

Through a series of worship services and social media posts between now and the election, we can encourage one another to "do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31) for the wellbeing of our lives, our families, our communities, and our world.

There will be a worship service at 10 AM that morning in the sanctuary. We will stop the work in the parish hall so everyone can participate in the worship service. The worship service will include several "Mission Moments" that will present some of the other mission and outreach work that we are doing, both locally and abroad.

A Special Sunday of Music



Dr. Brenda Portman, award-winning organist and composer, will be our guest at Calvary UMC on **Sunday, October 6**, for the worship service and the kick-off of the 2024-2025 Community Concert Series at 3 p.m.

At the morning worship service, Calvary's Sanctuary Choir will be performing "There's a Wideness in God's Mercy," a choral anthem composed by Dr. Portman. She will also be playing the last hymn and performing the postlude.

Renowned for her technique, musicianship, and flawless performance ability, her afternoon concert will include an original composition titled "Fanfare, Chorale, and Exultation." Other works include "Sonata No. 4 in E minor" by Bach, "Petit Triptyque" by Rachel Laurin, and a collection of spiritual music including "Steal Away" and "Every Time I Feel the Spirit."

Dr. Portman serves as the resident organist at Hyde Park Community United Methodist Church in Cincinnati, Ohio, where she is also the executive director of the church's distinguished Organ Concert Series. She is the organ instructor at Xavier University in Cincinnati and also teaches organ and piano privately.

In addition to a long list of awards for organ performance and composing, Dr. Portman is frequently commissioned for solo organ, organ-plus-instrument, and choral works. She also adjudicates organ competitions, presents workshops on contemporary organ repertoire, and enjoys educating youth about how pipe organs work. Her complete biography will be published in the afternoon concert program.

Celebrating the Women of our Church

Every woman of our church shares a common thread – we are all one in Christ. Whether you are a mother, daughter, grandmother, aunt, sister, in-law, friend, spouse, single, senior or youth – <u>we are all part of a bigger family of women who are united in faith</u>. As members of Calvary, we are also members of this great sisterhood of United Methodist women who support women and children around the world. Previously known as the United Methodist Women, the United Women in Faith's purpose is to know God, and to experience freedom as whole persons through Jesus Christ; to develop a creative, supportive fellowship, and to expand concepts of mission through participation in the global ministries of the church.

So, what does it mean to be a United Woman in Faith (UWFaith) and am I a member?

Being a UWFaith is simple – by being a member of our church you are a UWFaith member. Here are some examples of what the women of our church do to demonstrate being united in service and faith. They join Circles for fellowship and to organize plans for church events. They are members of Bible Study, Sunday School or social groups who meet each week to learn and study, or when a specific a project or event needs their support. I wrote last month of an initiative this forthcoming church year at Calvary through which we will work towards a renewed commitment to Christian hospitality by welcoming all who seek God's love, regardless of how different they may seem otherwise to us as strangers. Some may have felt disenfranchised by former UMC policies and others simply felt for one reason or another that they did not "fit in" with our congregation. Did not Jesus suggest (Mt 25:40) that when we welcome the stranger, especially someone different from us, that we meet Him as well? Oh, we might say, I already know Jesus! That may be true; but maybe on one such occasion we might have the experience captured by the late theologian Marcus Borg in the title of his 1995 book *Meeting Jesus Again for the First Time*!

It was such an experience about which Pastor Charles Sheldon preached in a small church in Topeka, KS, 100 years before Borg's book, in the early years of the social gospel movement in America. What began as a sermon series was transformed into one of the best selling books of all time, *In His Steps*, the spiritual journey of a small town congregation that could very well have been similar in its day to what Calvary UMC Frederick is today. In demographic language, it was likely a rather homogeneous upper middle class congregation. For most members, family and material life was good, a few quite wealthy. Some were leaders in the community, and others held an array of normal jobs. Most grew up in a church culture where following Jesus had been taught, preached, prayed and sung for as long as they could remember. Going to church on Sunday was an expected ritual; and, as in children's literature, "they lived happily ever after"

Until one Sunday morning! Upon which occasion, following routine morning prayer, creedal recitation, and scripture reading, then a well-prepared sermon that likely was more gratifying than challenging to their ears, and the beautiful music from the choir with a most talented soloist, a disheveled young man dressed in tattered clothing worn from street living rose from the back and came forth before the congregation. He had lost his job, his family, and his way in life, but had heard the music from outside and came in to listen. The lyrics he heard had been about following Jesus. And, though he apologized for his intrusion and did not expect any special treatment, he wondered aloud what church-going people successful in life, as this congregation certainly seemed to be, understood that to mean.

In short, the shock of this seeming intrusion prompted the pastor to challenge his congregation to follow in the steps of Jesus for one year by asking before each major decision they had to make at home or work or anywhere that year, "What would Jesus do?" And then to follow in His steps! Sheldon's book tells of the truly transformative spiritual experiences through which the congregation journeyed that year and the impact it had upon the entire community. It was indeed as though they had met Jesus again for the first time, and it had all been prompted by listening to and getting to know a stranger.


