these students build individual and ensemble skills along with confidence in performing. Their programs include works ranging from Bach, Brahms, and Mendelssohn to Mahler and Copland.



"thy kingdom come, thy will be done ..."

Taking a lead from my suggestion last month that our current season of Epiphany be considered as a revelation of God's calling us through the life of Jesus to be part of a kingdom different from earthly dominions of rule, a kingdom of light and love. That this is God's will for us we proclaim each Sunday in community worship through the prayer that Jesus taught us, a prayer focused on our life here on earth.

Some contemporary writers about the Scriptures have substituted the word "kin-dom" for "kingdom" to more closely approximate their understanding of what Jesus meant in His message about the Kingdon of God. In the words of Drew University theology professor Ada Marie Isasi-Diaz, "kin-dom" refers to the full inclusion and interdependent relationship of all of God's people; that in being kin with one another, loving our neighbor, we will find God.

As I write this article, the devastation of fires in the coastal palisades of Los Angeles, contrasted with the national mourning of the late President Jimmy Carter, have filled the news media. Where in this Epiphany season of light, I wondered, might one find God's light in such times of tragedy and loss.

The answer to that query came to me in the repeated references to a sense of community by news reporters, first responders, and those who lost their homes to fire. Their sense of hope and resilience at the same time of tears, exhaustion, and disbelief centered on the concept of being kin with one another, whether known neighbor or stranger, each having the other's back.

The reflections on President Carter, perhaps the least political of modern presidents who had already lived longer than most in this life, were focused on his service to others as a disciple of Jesus, a life committed to justice and mercy while walking humbly with the Lord, "kin-dom" personified.

The fact that books and song are written about finding God in unexpected places or at unexpected times is simply a function of our limited understanding of God's eternal presence. Thus, when we pray for God's kingdom on earth, let us remember that God is with us, calling us as individuals and as a congregation to be an active part of the "kin-dom."

Newsletter Article for February 2025 - Calvary's Reconciling Team

You may have noticed that Calvary UMC has a Reconciling Team! This group with the support of Pastor Steve, was formed under the ministry of our Church & Society work and approved to move forward by the Church Council in September of 2024. The Reconciling Team has been meeting since then and got the approval from Church Council in late November, to officially begin the reconciling process at Calvary UMC.

What is the Reconciling Process? Over the next several months, our team will begin a process of discernment, discussion, educational events, prayer and study – to consider becoming a Reconciling Congregation within the United Methodist denomination. Reconciling churches are United Methodist churches who have decided to identify themselves as reconciling and extend a special welcome to the LGBTQIA+ community. Such a designation makes it easier for LGBTQIA+ folks who are looking for a welcoming church to find us!

In April 2024, the General Conference of the UMC voted to remove the harmful language from our Book of Discipline and to approve the ordination and marriage of LGBTQIA+ persons. That decision on the global church level produced the conversations that led to Calvary's decision to move forward with the Reconciling Process.
