I am grateful for the kind words that many of you have shared with me and my wife upon the announce of our retirement. In the time between now and July 1, I will be savoring the relationships I have here and appreciating the faith and witness that this congregation offers. In a United Methodist congregation, pastors are not selected or hired by the local church. Instead, the bishop sends or "appoints" a clergyperson to serve as the pastor. This means that the church will not have to wait or go through a long process of discernment or call in order to receive a new pastor. Our district superintendent has meet with the Staff Parish Relations Committee to discuss the needs of the congregation and prepare a profile that will be used by the Bishop to select someone to serve as the next pastor. The church can expect that someone will be named in the coming weeks or months and then a process can be started for the transition.

## 2025 Lenten Study

"Your Kingdom Come" and "Your Kin-dom Come": How Might the Lord's Prayer Help Us Live More Fully in our Global World?

What are the challenges of living in a "global" world? What does "global" mean, anyway? And how might the Lord's Prayer be a kind of guide and help for us as we make our way in this complex kind of world? This will be the central theme of our five sessions of Lenten study, guided by The Reverend Dr. William ("Gilen") Thompson-Uberuaga, and his recent book, *Your Kin-dom Come: The Lord's Prayer in a Global Age.* A donation of \$5.00 for the Kindle edition, or \$15.00 for the paperback, is requested. But donation or no, all will be able to have the book.



The Rev. Dr. William ("Gilen") Thompson-Uberuaga is a native of Boise, Idaho, and a priest of the Episcopal Church. "Fr. Gilen," as he is known in the Church, regularly assists in the Diocese of Maryland, when requested. He is now retired, and is an emeritus professor of theology, Duquesne University (Pittsburgh). His career was as a theology professor. He has authored numerous articles and books, most recently, besides the *Your Kin-dom Come*, he has written *Jesus and the Gospel Movement*. 
Wednesday, April 9 ~ week 5

## Celebrating diversity in the spirit of unity


In our belief of Divine origins of the universe, it should not be surprising that humans and their cultures, as other forms of creation in geophysical, vegetation, and animal form, are to be celebrated in their diversity. Scripture reminds us in Genesis 1-2 of diversity as a theme of God's creation, yet through the Spirit God brings order out of chaos. Consistent with this theme, sharing the word of God's love with people of diverse cultural and regional heritage, the Apostle Paul proclaimed that through Christ Jesus God's Spirit brings unity out of diversity (Gal 3:28). Paul repeats this theme in his reference to diverse spiritual gifts unified within one body, the church (1 Cor 12).

Despite political rhetoric to the contrary from some in any era of our nation's history, at least as many have proclaimed that the diversity of heritage among our population is one of our nation's greatest strengths. From the welcoming poem inscribed on the Statue of Liberty to the aspirational words of our Declaration of Independence and Constitution, there is implicit if not overt celebration of such diversity with liberty and equal justice under the law for all. As such, our nation's motto remains *e plurubus unum*, "out of many, one,"

Despite our nation's many strengths, however, these ideals have been more aspirational than realized for many. Subject to God's call for reconciliation over the years, our nation and the Christian church have sought to address injustices experienced by women, immigrants in general, people of color including our Native Americans, and those of different faith traditions. As our congregation has been recently informed, another reconciliation initiative is underway at Calvary, this one focused on our brothers and sisters of the LGBTQIA+ community,


