

#### From the Pastor

Francis Collins is a scientist and physician who was the head of the Human Genome Project and served as the director of NIH, the National Institutes of Health, from 2009 to 2021. He is an evangelical Christian and has written about the intersection of science and religion in *The Language of God, A Scientist Presents Evidence for Belief.* He has a new book out called *The Road to Wisdom: On Truth, Science, Faith, and Trust* which I plan to read soon.

I heard Collins recently in a podcast interview. He had some helpful advice about how to weigh the truth and value of what we come across in social media and news outlets. Not everything that is out there is true or helpful! Collin offered some principles to follow when we are presented with claims and information. First, we should consider where the claim comes from. Who is making this claim? And if it is a claim is particularly upsetting or makes you fear angry or fearful, then you should be skeptical. Don't just accept it on face value. Someone who is making that claim or passing on that bit of information may be trying to manipulate you. They may have an agenda at odds with your well-being or the well-being of the community.

Collins says it is appropriate to ask a few questions: "Is this a source that has a history of integrity? Whether it's a person or an institution, what's the track record here? What's their level of competence? Is this actually an expert who's done the work to dig deeply into an issue? What's their level of humility? Are they giving you the whole story or just getting your worried and upset? All these things ought to factor in to how you evaluate the truth of what you are hearing. But that takes time.

United Methodists have often used four questions to help discern what is true and helpful. We start by considering what Scripture has to say. Then we go on to consider any claim in light of Experience, Tradition and Reason. That is a helpful place to start. When we take in news and stories and various claims, we may not be able to weigh and evaluate all that we hear and see. But, we can give more weight to trusted sources, be open to hearing alternative points of view, and recognize that our own views may need to be revised in light of new information. I find that to be a helpful guide to use when we are presented with an endless stream of news and information.







## The cost of discipleship ....

As this newsletter is circulated during our Lenten spiritual journey with Jesus, it is the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer's death by hanging as a Christian martyr standing up for God's love against the tyranny of the Nazi regime. In this and his ministry, he enacted the call of Jesus for those who wish to be his disciples to take up their cross and follow him (Mt 16:24-25).

In his classic book on discipleship, by the title of this article, Bonhoeffer reminds us, as Jesus did his followers, that to take up our cross is not merely to endure the normal challenges of this life. Rather, it is an intentional act to sacrifice our life, even suffering persecution from others, through our adherence to Jesus in pursuit of God's Kingdom here on earth. In his Sermon on the Mount, Jesus had said: "Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven" (Mt 5:10).

It was just 60 years ago at this time of year also that the late Congressman John L. Lewis as a young man and other Christian followers of The Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. were assaulted by authorities of the state as they marched and prayed for the civil rights of Black Americans in Alabama. In their non-violent protests of injustice, they had taken up their cross to follow Jesus.

In his foreword *Memoire* to Bonhoeffer's *The Cost of Discipleship*, jurist Gerhard Leibholz makes the following point: "What Dietrich Bonhoeffer and others did cannot be expected of the many. The future in modern society depends much more on the quiet heroism of the very few who are inspired by God ...who will be prepared to stand for the dignity of man and true freedom, and to keep the law of God ..."

In the baptism of our children into the Christian faith, we vowed to resist evil, injustice, and oppression in whatever forms they present themselves. I pray this Lenten season that we at Calvary may be among those few who will take up our cross and follow Jesus in pursuit of justice in this world according to God's law as taught and modeled by Jesus in his journey to the Roman cross.
