Calvary United Methodist Church of Frederick sponsored a Sleep in Heavenly Peace (SHP) bed build on Thursday evening, June 12, with 57 members and a few visitors taking part. Dave Herber led the activity and began by providing instructions to the volunteers, encouraging them to work quickly but safely. He said to them “Remember, we’re not building fine furniture!”

Volunteers worked in assembly line fashion. Teams sanded each piece of precut wood to remove blemishes and rough edges, ensuring a safe surface. They then assembled the bed frames using drills, screws, and other tools. The design typically includes headboards, side rails, and slats to support the mattress. Each component was carefully secured to create a sturdy and reliable structure and then stained to enhance durability and provide a uniform finish.

A unique feature of SHP beds is the organization’s branded logo, which is burned into the headboard component before staining as a signature mark of craftsmanship. This is a favorite task for the younger volunteers! All assembled components also underwent a quality check to ensure they met safety standards and were ready for use.

Everyone had fun and we managed to complete 34 beds in a small amount of time. After the work was completed, we enjoyed ice cream from Rocky Point Creamery. Now that was a treat! Thirty-four kids in Frederick County will be excited when they receive these beds along with mattresses and bedding later this summer. The beds will be delivered to homes and assembled by SHP volunteer delivery teams.

The bed-building process at *Sleep in Heavenly Peace* is more than just woodworking — it’s a community-driven effort that brings people together to make a tangible difference in children's lives. Through teamwork, dedication, and generosity, SHP and partners like Calvary UMC continue to provide comfort and dignity to those who need it most.





Finance will begin providing the congregation with quarterly reports on the financial condition of Calvary. The plan is to provide a brief article for the Newsletter on a quarterly basis.

First a high-level overview from 2024, followed by the current period.

Operating funds exclude restricted funds such as Memorial contributions, Sleep In Heavenly Peace, various Music Funds, Scholarships, and many other specifically designated contributions made by our congregants, and the Calvary Trust Fund. The combined restricted funds balance was \$112,694.

Total sources of operating funds declined in 2024 compared to those of 2023, and expenses were greater than they were in 2023 resulting in operating loss and depleting the Church's cash balance.

The major source of operating funds is cash, envelope, and contributions that come in by way of electronic payment, and this source of funds declined in 2024. Expenses that showed the biggest increases were utilities; the past winter was unseasonably cold with snow, and Conference payments. In 2023, we fell way behind on obligations to Conference. Calvary Trust Fund has funded major repairs to the buildings.

For the period through May 2025, the trend of operating losses has continued and our cash in the bank continued to decline to a level that created some concern.

Quite unexpectedly, in early June we received several checks as part of the federal government's Employee Retention program in the net amount of \$111,777. The refunds were calculated based on the church's salaries and wages during the pandemic. An additional amount of around \$60,000 is expected to be received in the future.
