This book will also shape our new worship series beginning in September. If you would like to read along, I encourage you to pick up a copy of the book, it will deepen our conversations and help us walk together through the heart of Jesus' teaching.

Friends, September marks more than just the start of a new program year. It's a reminder that God is always doing a new thing in our midst. My prayer is that each of us will find a way to grow, to serve, and to take a next step in our faith this year, whether that's through a class, a ministry, or a new act of service.

"From the beginning ...

...God called us into covenant, bound with God, with one another, and with God's wonderfully diverse creation. ...Created in God's image to live in covenant with God, we honor the dignity of all beings and affirm the goodness of life. ...By God's grace we are called to be more Christ like, and thus to become merciful, just, and compassionate. Responding to that call, we seek to follow Jesus who gave boundless love to all."

This summarizing statement from the Preamble to the *Social Principles of the United Methodist Church*, 2025-2028 (p. 19) reminds us that we are created to live in harmonious community with God, other humans, and all else of God's creation. The *Social Principles*, updated by the General Conference of the UMC in 2024, remind us of our needs to reconcile that harmony in four broad categories of community: <u>all creation</u>. <u>Economic</u>, <u>social</u>, and <u>political</u>.

This Fall, at a time to be announced, following a year of sharing, study, and discernment, our Calvary family will make a decision as to whether it wishes to become formally recognized as a Reconciling Congregation within the United Methodist Church by endorsing the following Reconciling Ministry Statement, a statement consistent with the *Social Principles*:

We celebrate God's gift of diversity and value the wholeness made possible in community equally shared and shepherded by all. We welcome and affirm people of every gender identity, gender expression, and sexual orientation who are also of every age, race, ethnicity, physical and mental ability, level of education, and family structure, and of every economic, immigration, marital, and social status, and so much more. We acknowledge that we live in a world of profound social, economic, and political inequities. As followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to the pursuit of justice and pledge to stand in solidarity with all who are marginalized and oppressed.

In another article of this issue of the *Messenger* is an announcement of three planned listening sessions in September for anyone in the congregation who may have questions or concerns about adopting this statement. The sessions will be co-chaired by the Rev. Vicky Starnes and the Rev. Dr. Beth Hutton.

During this final period of discernment as a congregation, may we also prayerfully seek God's guidance and grace, such that, even though we may not all be of one opinion, we may welcome and open our hearts as well as our church doors to all who seek God's love, in a safe and affirming faith community of the United Methodist Church.


