- 6. If you want to, you can add something small into the envelopes, like a bookmark, candy cane, or magnet. Just remember that you may need to pay extra postage if your envelope is heavy.
- 7. Once you've completed the challenge, email Christy Mossburg and share how many cards that you sent for the Calvary Christmas Card Challenge so we can add it to our grand total.
