THE PASSION

Prayer of Confession

Let us pray:

Holy Savior, in one Sunday it seems too much to go from shouts of hosanna to the crucifixion. Yet Palm Sunday and Good Friday are bound together, just as our own stories are bound together with yours. We read of the disciples in Gethsemane, and we remember that we too often find our eyes heavy with exhaustion or even apathy when we should be praying for deliverance.

We read of the betrayal of Judas and see in him our own betrayals, too often delivered with a kiss.

We read of the confusion of the disciples, even now getting Jesus' teaching wrong, and hear your call for peace even at the hour of your death.

We read of the desert of the disciples and cannot begin to count the times we have deserted you.

And we know what comes next in the story. We know that Jesus is handed over to be crucified. He is mocked, tortured, and then killed. He even cries out, feeling forsaken.

We read ourselves there too in some ways, in the pain and in the alone-ness. But we rarely can read ourselves in your solidarity and love for all people.

We read and we know we are so many in the story. The disciples in their confusion and abandonment, even Judas and Peter in their betrayals, the chief priests in their deception, the Roman in their senseless violence, and perhaps even Simon of Cyrene with his burden and fear and the women who stood watch even when the horror was too great to bear.

Forgive us when we enact the fear and violence more than than the solidarity and love exhibited in the story. Forgive us for our greed and our deceptions. Forgive us for our betrayals.
