Introduction and Presentation of the Candidate

Renunciation of Sin and Baptismal Vows *The pastor addresses parents:* On behalf of the whole church, I ask you: Do you renounce the spiritual forces of wickedness, reject the evil powers of this world, and repent of your sin? I do.
